

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Introduction

In the course of the call for the third EU Health Programme 2014-2020 by DG SANCO (now SANTÈ) it was decided to launch a new Joint Action on eHealth, namely the **Joint Action to support the eHealth Network (eHN-JA)**, with the intention to act as the main preparatory body for the eHealth Network. The national competent authorities of the EU Member States nominated themselves and/or other bodies to act as associated or collaborating partner in this joint action and started with the preparatory work in November 2014. The joint action's description of work was set up in alignment with the four main priority areas defined in the eHealth Network's Multiannual Work Plan (MWP) 2015-2018. In order to establish and maintain a structured process for interaction with the eHealth Network the following overall governance structure is foreseen by the eHN-JA:




As the joint action officially started on 1st May 2015, this document contains specific information related to the general working approach of this joint action aiming to help its participants to better reflect the needs of the eHealth Network members at early stage and to inform about the future interaction process between the Network and the joint action.

2. Any possible changes of activities:

Any changes of the tasks and corresponding deliverables as shown in the timeline require an official amendment request of the multilateral grant agreement of the eHN-JA toward the European Commission (Chafea) and depend on resources available within the joint action. Any possible requests coming from the eHealth Network and resulting in need for adaptation of the joint action's description of work shall be considered carefully.

3. Stakeholder involvement:

In general, only eHealth stakeholders acting on the EU level (e.g. health professionals, patients, standardization organizations, health insurance organizations, industry, etc.) shall get involved.

The joint action will involve different stakeholders in a transparent and structured way. This will be done through a separate work package (WP4) with the intention to invite, plan and target input provided by any stakeholder group to select tasks. In order to give the stakeholders — which are not part of the eHN-JA — a voice on topics that they consider relevant for their membership a dedicated secretariat will take care of stakeholder management.

Standardization organizations will additionally get involved based on recommendations of deliverable D5.4.1 of WP5 through a platform consisting of the relevant standards developing organizations.

4. Types and structure of deliverables:

The joint action proposes the following types of deliverables that can be submitted by the joint action to the Network:

Type of deliverable:	Action to be achieved:	Nature of deliverable:
Report	For information only	Intended to provide the Network's members with well investigated information on previous activities/actions/submitted documents/etc. in the field of eHealth.
Discussion paper	Having an informed discussion	Intended to provide the Network's members with necessary relevant information enabling an in-depth discussion about a certain topic and possible next steps to be taken.

Guideline	For adoption	Intended to present to the Network's members a clear guideline with the intention for it to be adopted and optionally implemented by the EU MS at national level in the next step.
Recommendations	For adoption	Intended to recommend actions to be taken in cases where the Network's members need to agree on them. Recommendation can be combined with other types of deliverables as well.
Information paper	For information only	Intend to provide the Network's members with current state-of-play information on a certain topic and possible next steps to be taken that do not require adoption by the Network's members.
Policy paper	For adoption / decision	Contains proposed items for adoption and/or decision that may affect a MS national policy level.
Briefing note	For adoption / decision	Contains proposed items for adoption and/or decision that affect the operational work structure of either the Network or the eHN-JA.

5. General elaboration process of deliverables intended for the submission to the eHealth Network:

Deliverables intended for the submission to the eHealth Network usually will be elaborated by any of the four content-related work packages of the joint action in collaboration with the respective task and work package leader and with all project members having expressed interest to contribute. To that end a quality management scheme will ensure stringent and comprehensive, yet effective document elaboration. Final deliverables need to be adopted by the strategic project steering committee before being submitted to the eHealth Network.

6. Transparent documentation of involved parties in submitted deliverables:

All deliverables submitted shall contain information on:

- <u>Authoring team:</u> Names of authors and their organizations involved in drafting process;
- Organizations with comments: Names of project internal and external organizations that submitted comments during the different review phases.
