Vaccination subgroup - mandate

The vaccination subgroup:



- advises the Commission on how to support Member States in increasing the uptake of vaccination
- advises on the identification, validation and transfer of best and/or promising practices in terms of increasing vaccination uptake
- informs on national/regional actions aiming to increase vaccination uptake and provide recommendations to the Commission on how to support such efforts
- Mandate prolonged until December 2025



Vaccination subgroup - activities

- **First meeting on 30 March 2023:** Consultation of the subgroup on Commission proposal for a Council Recommendation on vaccine-preventable cancers
- **Second meeting on 4 October 2023:** Presentation of the Public Health Expert Group priority-setting exercise, the "Overcoming Obstacles to Vaccination" project and the #UnitedInProtection communication campaign
- Third meeting on 18 April 2024: Measles outbreaks, upcoming joint action on cancers caused by infections, vaccine-preventable cancers and addressing communicable diseases (HIV/AIDS, Tuberculosis, Hepatitis), joint EU/WHO immunisation project
- Fourth meeting: Q4 2024



Network of Expertise on Long COVID

- Established in 2023, it brings together national institutions involved in Long COVID work to:
 - To advise on ways to strengthen EU- and national-level responses to Long COVID.
 - To provide a platform for exchanges of national experiences on diagnosis, treatment and management of Long COVID
 - To collect information regarding the situation on Long COVID in Member States.
- **EU4Health project on Long COVID**: EUR 1.5 million and 7 initiatives to be implemented with the WHO and OECD.



Upcoming project: Long COVID Action (2024-2026)

Seven actions:

Action 1. Identification of Research Needs and Priorities (OECD, WHO)

Establishing a collaborative framework to prioritize Long COVID research, identify most urgent research gaps and inform policy decisions.

Action 2. Training for Healthcare Professionals (OECD)

Developing an EU-wide training programme for healthcare professionals on developing technical knowledge for:

- Detection and addressing early symptoms of Long COVID
- Appropriate patient referral (diagnosis and treatment.

Action 3. Guidelines, Clinical Recommendations, Good Clinical Practice (WHO)

Enhancing Long COVID management through international collaboration on clinical guidelines based on evidence delivered to Member States.

Upcoming project: Long COVID Action (2024-2026)

Seven actions:

Action 4. Patient Engagement and Support (OECD, WHO)

Improving EU-level engagement and quality of life of Long COVID patients through collaborative stakeholder and citizen involvement. This includes:

- An Open Stakeholder Group in the EU HPP.
- A citizens' panel through the Commission's citizen engagement platform.

Action 5. Assessment of the Social and Economic Consequences (OECD)

Developing a study to assess the socio-economic impact of Long COVID in Member States, Norway and Iceland. This includes the impact of Long COVID on:

- Healthcare
- Social services
- Long-term care
- Labour market.



Upcoming project: Long COVID Action (2024-2026)

Seven actions:

Action 6. Development of a Case Definition (WHO)

Establishing a standardized EU case definition for Long COVID to enhance diagnostic accuracy and data comparability. This will be agreed with Member States.

Action 7. Working towards a Surveillance System (WHO)

Implementing a unified EU-level surveillance system for Long COVID to enhance data collection and health outcomes. This will be achieved through:

- Improving the collection of epidemiological data.
- Conducting population-based epidemiological studies.

A prospective longitudinal study on the incidence of Long COVID in middle-income countries and/or a retrospective registry study in advanced economies in the WHO European Region will be conducted.

Mental III-health Causes a Significant Health And Economic Burden To EU/EFTA Countries

- Mental ill-health reduces healthy life expectancy and decrease workforce productivity across the EU/EFTA;
- At current levels of coverage, treatment is provided to less than 1 in 3 persons in need;
- Best practice interventions in primary care, schools and workplace have a medium to large effect in promoting mental well-being;
- The report will be finalized by Q4-2024 and released by Q1-2025.



Stronger Action and More Ambitious Targets for Prevention Can Bend The Raising Cost of Cancer

- By 2050, health spending on cancer will rise in the OECD due to ageing and better cancer outcomes;
- A significant share of cancer cases can be prevented, scaling up action on prevention could help curb the growing cancer burden
- More ambitious targets on other risk factors, together with stronger action to achieve them, could see a greater impact on cancer
- The report will be finalized by Q3-2024 and released by Q4-2024



OECD Supports The Scaling Up And The Transfer Of Best Practices To Prevent And Control NCDs

- OECD assesses 'real-world' public health policies against standard criteria and policies' transferability;
- Policies are selected in close communication with countries and the EC to focus on priorities;
- We assess policies and identify 'dos' and 'don'ts' to help countries transfer best practices; if data is available, we make the economic case;
- The focus is on healthier lifestyles, integrated care, healthy environments, mental health and addictions.





Saving Lives and Livelihood: Optimising Health-Economic Trade-offs Of Public Health Interventions In Pandemics

- The analysis considers 5 epidemic outbreaks with different characteristics
- Non-pharmaceutical interventions in the analysis include: social distancing, school closures, workplace policies, travel restrictions, community-based IPC, testing & tracking
- The report will be finalized and released by Q1-2025








UNICEF APPROCH TO CHILD HEALTH

Mapping of Proton Therapy Centres

The EIB has conducted a study to update and improve the lending policy and appraisal processes regarding proton therapy, specifically:

- Better understand the geographical distribution of proton therapy centres in Europe
- Clarify the general evolutions of the sector, notably in terms of technology, costs and set up
- Assess the challenges and difficulties in establishing new proton therapy centres
- Assess the growth potential of proton therapy in Europe

Results from the study (an Executive Summary and a detailed report) will be available in July

- Through the Advisory Hub support, international consultants in coordination with EIB experts provided the Municipality of Burgas with a comprehensive feasibility study that included functional planning and preliminary design for the hospital, while supporting also the tender preparation.
- This process unlocked the opportunity for an investment of the EIB, which materialized in the signature of a EUR 12.8 m loan agreement with the Municipality of Burgas.
- The new hospital premises will help attract and retain skilled medical professionals in the region. In addition, it will also be linked to the Medical Faculty of the University in Burgas, facilitating university research and training of medical staff.
- The following design and build tender was successfully awarded and the **start of works** ceremony took place at the beginning of 2024.
- Based on the positive experience with the advisory, the Ministry of Health requested the support for the new National Pediatric Hospital in Sofia.

Mandate: Invest EU



The project supports Vitalia's expansion plan during the period 2023 - 2026 by financing the construction and equipping of several new facilities: long-term care centres mainly for the elderly population, rehabilitation hospitals and assisted living apartments.



The promoter, Vitalia Plus S.A., is a leading private sector provider of long-term care services in Spain with an established track record that includes cooperation with the public sector (currently more than 50% of Vitalia's total residential beds are publicly financed and all their centres are certified under the Dependency Care Act (eligible for individual residential care subsidy).



The project will add 230 rehabilitation beds, 1,840 residential care beds and 434 places for assisted living to Vitalia's capacity. The new buildings will achieve very low energy levels and comply with the Taxonomy substantial contribution to climate change mitigation.



€25 million credit line backed by InvestEU to support clinical development of treatments for long COVID. To support the late clinical trial development of the Company's lead asset for long COVID. This operation highlights the EIB's commitment to tackling long COVID, a major public health problem affecting millions of people worldwide.

GeNeuro is evaluating the clinical efficacy of a sixmonth treatment with temelimab, the anti-W-ENV antibody developed by GeNeuro to improve cognitive impairment and fatigue in long COVID patients who test positive for the presence of the W-ENV protein.



The W-ENV protein was observed in more than 25% of patients with persistent symptoms after having had COVID.

If the current clinical trial is successful, this personalised medicine approach could offer a therapeutic solution to the millions of patients affected by long COVID.
