



Low literacy skills


Low numeracy skills












What about qualifications?

Main drivers of the New Skills Agenda for Europe

- Digital transformation
- Skills mismatches (affect productivity and growth)
- EU workforce ageing and shrinking
- Quality of education and training varies in EU
- Perceptions not rooted in reality (e.g. VET)
- Importance of learning outside the formal system



10 Key Measures in 3 Priority Areas:

- I. Improving the quality and relevance of skills formation
- II. Making skills and qualifications more visible and comparable
- III. Improving skills intelligence and information for better career choices

- ✓ Skills gaps/shortages and potential impact on growth, innovation and competitiveness
- ✓ Maturity of the growth strategy for the sector
- ✓ Stakeholder involvement and commitment

- ✓ Skills implications of sector strategy: e.g. shortages, impact on employment
- ✓ Sector skills strategy + concrete solutions + long term action plan
- ✓ Use of EU tools: e.g. EQF, ESCO, Europass
- ✓ Successful projects and best practice, including funding

National/ regional partnerships

- √ Strategies and actions adapted to national/regional context
- ✓ Business-education-research partnerships on the ground
- ✓ Visibility and dissemination of results, feeding back to EU/national/regional policies, initiatives and intelligence tools.

✓ Non-structured: many possibilities (e.g. existing groups and structures, social dialogue, calls for tender, E+)

✓ Pilot: Erasmus+, COSME, EMFF, other possibilities in the future

✓ Indirect: ESF, ERDF, national/regional, private funding
