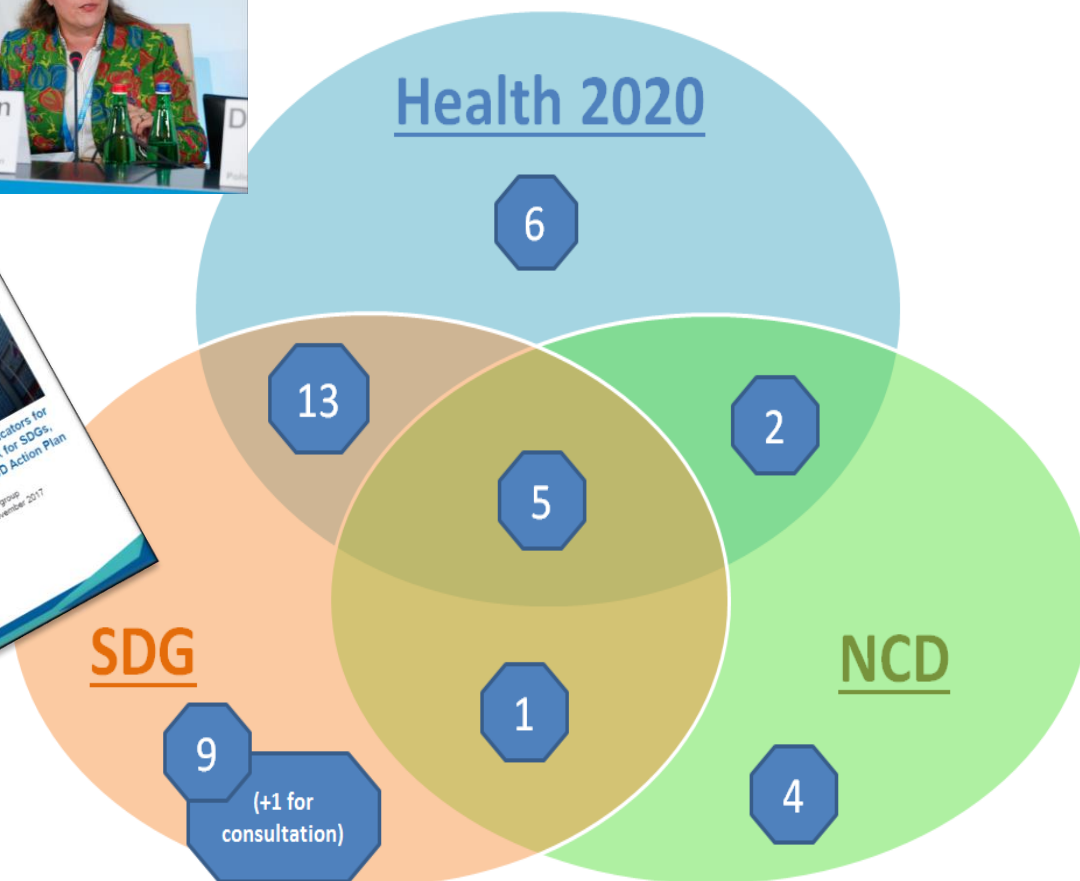
Mapping activities (1/2)

- **Mapping the overlap between six main health indicator sets used in Europe (March 2017)**
To gain insight into the overlap between a selection of health indicator sets currently used in Europe.
- **Agreements forged by WHO-EC-OECD at Ispra (June 2017)**
Set of self-commitments aimed at reducing the number of data requests and collected indicators; and set of joint commitments towards improving collaboration.
- **Developing a common set of indicators for the joint monitoring framework for SDGs, Health 2020 and the Global NCD Action Plan (September 2017)**
Member States agreed to adopt a joint monitoring framework for reporting on indicators for the SDG, H2020 and the Global Action Plan for NCD.

Mapping activities (2/2)

- **EHII Steering Group pre-meeting (March 2018)**
To establish the Indicator Mapping Subgroup of the Steering Group of the WHO EHII and to conduct an in-depth analysis of 3 commonly used indicators.
- **Indicator mapping subgroup of the Steering Group of the WHO EHII meeting (October 2018)**
To finalize the terms of reference of the subgroup; To present initial findings of the work initiated in March 2018, a pilot using three indicator topics (alcohol consumption, life expectancy and vaccination coverage).

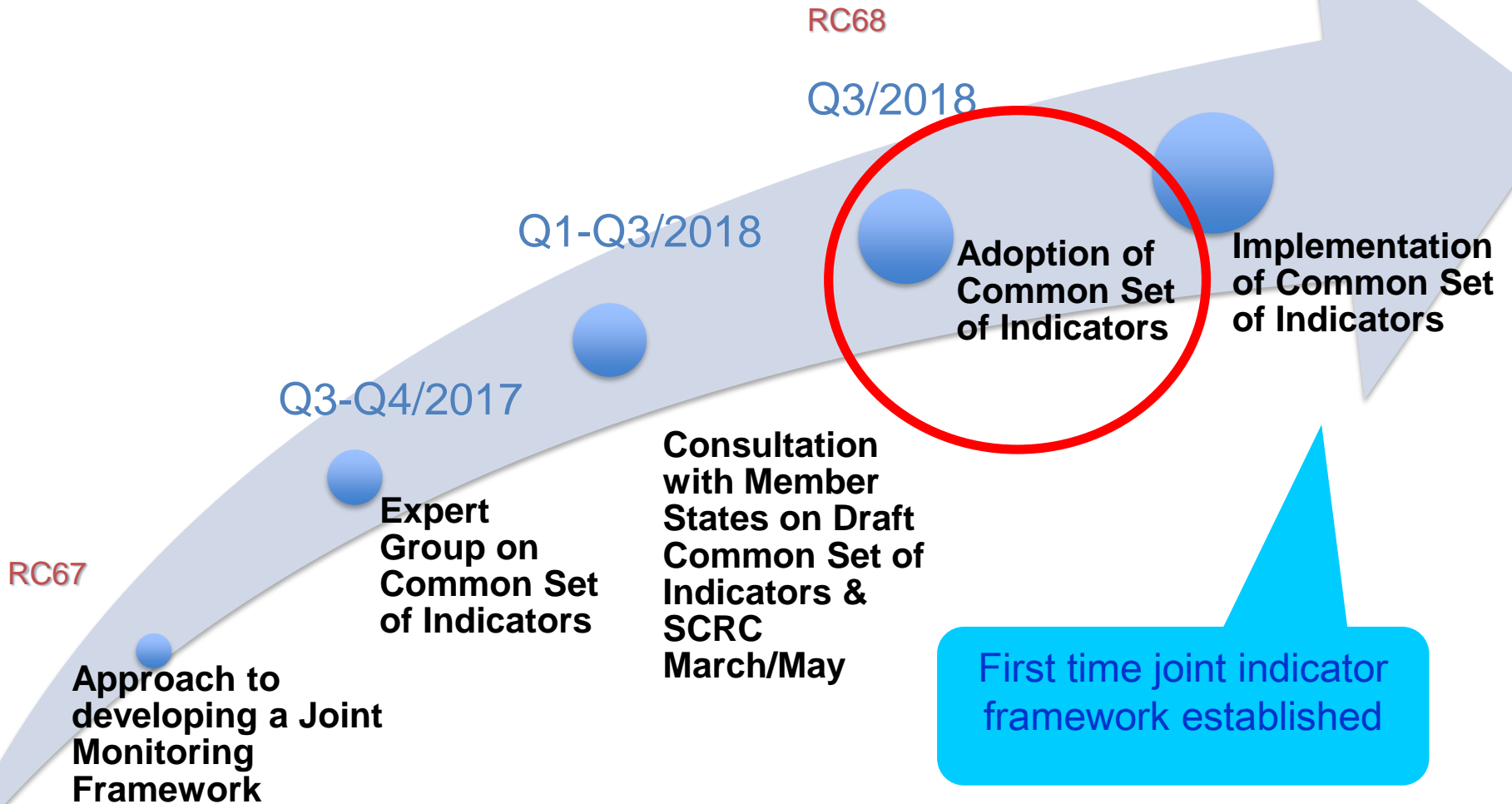

Mapping activities – Next steps

- **68th session of the WHO Regional Committee for Europe** (September, 2018) - Key outcomes (Follow up):
 1. To **adopt and implement the Joint Monitoring Framework** in the context of the roadmap to implement the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, building on Health 2020, the European policy for health and well-being, EUR/RC68(1).
 2. To review all existing core indicators, in particular the **Health 2020 indicators** and enter into a second phase indicator development in collaboration with the EC and the OECD in the coming biennium.
- To follow up with the **Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS) health information network** to obtain a summary of the findings of its work to identify commonalities, overlaps and differences between the main indicator sets used by CIS countries.
- **Next meeting** of the Indicator mapping subgroup of the Steering Group of the WHO EHII in January 2019 – Topics: terms of reference; follow up study lead by RIVM; draft workplan.

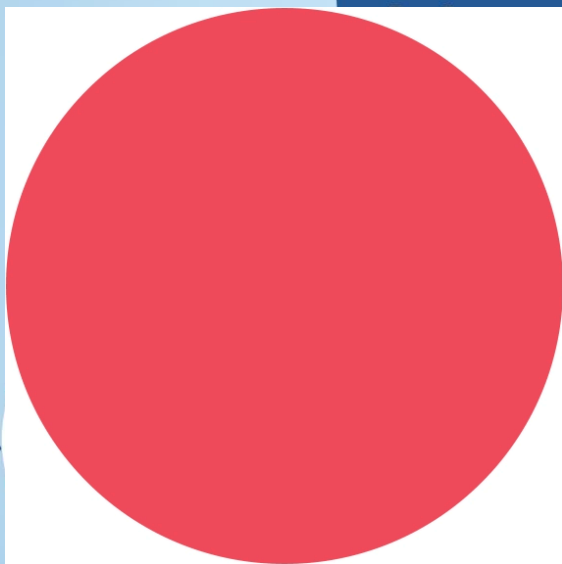

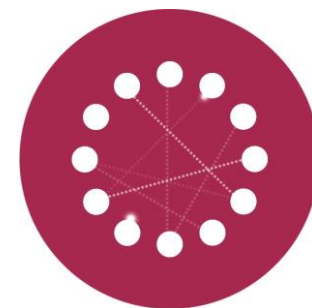
