






The main principles are the same: international cooperation, prevention, humanism, pragmatism, safety, coordination, subsidariety and participation


Decrease 10% by 2016 and 20% by 2020 the prevalence of binge drinking pattern, in the Portuguese population

Reduce the standardized mortality rate for diseases attributed to alcohol (in the Portuguese population above 65 years) to 12,5%000

Decrease the number of causalities in road accidents related with alcohol consumption following the goals of the National Road Safety Strategy

SUPLY DOMAIN Guarantee that the provision, sale and consumption of licit psychoactive substances is done in a safe way and not to induce the harmless use/consumption, through proper legislation, regulation and inspection




