



# Thematic conditionality for Social inclusion, combating poverty and discrimination

- National strategic policy framework for poverty reduction
  - ... depending on the identified needs, includes measures for the shift from institutional to community based care.
- National or regional strategic policy health policy for health
  - Mesures to improve access to health services
  - •Measures to stimulate efficiency in the health sector, through deployment of service delivery models and infrastructure

#### **General ex-ante conditionality**

Anti-discrimination

Administrative capacity for the implementation and application of EU antidiscrimination law and policy in the field of ESI Funds

Diability

Administrative capacity for the implementation of UN CPRD





### Programming period 2014-2020

- Territorial approach
  - Slovakia (Roma Atlas)
  - Hungary (micro-regions)
- Urban approach
  - Bulgaria deprived neighbourhoods
  - France deprived neighbourhoods
- Education early childhood services
  - Slovakia, Hungary, Romania, Bulgaria, etc.
- Housing
  - Slovakia, Hungary, Romania, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, France, etc.





# **ERDF** support for housing infrastructure

- 2 thematic areas: social inclusion and energy efficiency
- Housing infrastrucure measures should be aligned with the operational programmes objectives
- 1.4 billion EUR has been allocated to housing by Member States (PL, HU, IT, ES, PT)
- Integrated approach in place close link to education, emplyoment, health and other areas
- Actions should contribute to desegregregation of marginalised communities, such as Roma, migrants, homeless, disabled (specific guidance issued by the Commission)




# Sustainable urban development (Art. 7 ERDF regulation)

- Sustainable urban development strategies as a prerequisite for urban development – to be submitted to the managing authorities
- 5% of ERDF should be allocated to sustainable urban development
- Economic, environmental, climate, demographic and social challenges should be addressed by the strategies and ERDF actions
- Local authorities are responsible for the implementation, such as opening call for proposals, etc.
- 15 billion EUR will be used by local authorities under Art.7 (100 billion EUR the total budget used by cities)






# Thematic focus-urban development strategies (ERDF funding)

Key areas of funding


- Low carbon economy (Energy efficiency, sustainable urban mobility)



# **Urban Agenda for the EU**

- 7/10 Juncker priorities have urban dimension
- It is mostly cities who deliver on-the-ground
  - ⇒ We need to work more with cities
  - ⇒ We need to work more on urban matters
  - ⇒ We need to ask more from cities (delivery)
- UA is the 'chapeau' of all EU urban policies
- MS, cities, EP, CoR, EESC support the UA

#### Instrument to:

- Work more on urban matters
- Work more with cities
- Ask more from cities

#### Objective to have:

- Better Legislation (EU, national, cities)
- Better Funding (EU, national, cities)
- Better Knowledge (EU, national, cities)

Concrete actions in an Action Plan – first draft by June 2017





# **Urban Agenda for the EU**

- Pact of Amsterdam + Council conclusions
  - = Commitment
  - = Definition of the scope (12 topics)
  - = Methodology to have results
- Concrete actions on 12 topics (Action Plans)
  - + 4 topics as start (Air quality, Urban poverty, Inclusion of migrants and refuges, Housing)
  - + 4 more partnerships (Jobs and Skills, Urban mobility, Difital transition, Circular Economy)
