Context

The Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Agriculture are working on a new "Restriction of Antimicrobial Resistance and Prudent Use of Antibiotics Plan "One Health" for 2019-2023 ". The plan indicates concrete activities and results to be achieved, responsible institutions for implementing the plan as well as the necessary resources (funds) for implementing all activities.

Support delivered

The support is provided by DG REFORM over 24 months in the form of continuous technical advice, which consists of:

- Literature review, interviews, workshops, study visits, trainings, pilot
- Design of a sustainability plan for continued work on implementing the One Health NAP
- Farm and Hospital Toolbox
- Roadmap on increased national, intersectoral communication.

Expected results

Support aims at the following results:

1. The Centre for Disease Prevention and Control and Food and Veterinary Service is empowered to best implement the One Health action plan.
2. Human and animal health professionals and animal farmers are provided with skills and tools for prudent use of as a mean to prevent and contain AMR.
3. An intersectoral coordinating mechanism (ICM) is put in place to support information sharing and collaboration between sectors on various aspects of AMR among relevant professionals.



The technical support instrument (TSI)

How does it work?

An EU Member State wishing to receive technical support [submits a request](#) to the Commission, via a national Coordinating Authority. This request must be submitted by 31 October of each year.

The Commission analyses the requests received and enters into dialogue with the national Coordinating Authorities to assess the country's specific needs and the options to support the design and implementation of the reforms.

Support may be provided directly through the Commission's in-house expertise or with other providers of technical support:

- experts from EU Member States' national administrations (TAIEX)
- international organisations
- private firms and consultancies
- individual experts from the private sector

Possibilities for submission of multi-country requests under TSI 2022

Formats

Description

1 Similar/same coordinated requests

Similar/same requests submitted by several Member States, following coordination between these Member States: after the selection, the requests may be merged into a joint project

2 “Lead” request

Request submitted by **one Member State** (“lead” Member State), **involving or on behalf of one or several other Member States** (option will be developed if Member States express strong interest)
