Introduction

All Forum members agree that:

- Underage alcohol consumption is a key issue that needs to be addressed in the fight against alcohol related harm
- Effectively tackling this requires a holistic approach to a complex issue
- Laws exist in all EU Member States on the sale of alcohol to minors
- All stakeholders can have a role to play in tackling the issue and reducing underage access to alcohol requires a collective effort from all stakeholders, including economic operators
- Collective effort does not have to mean all parties working together in all areas at all times, but all parties working together in the same direction through:
 - Implementation and enforcement
 - Information and education
 - Empowerment and training
 - Responsibility and engagement

The role for economic operators

Economic operators are neither in a position to police the law nor to speak to minors on the dangers of underage drinking.

However economic operators have a responsiblity and a role to play working throughout the value chain.

These include:

- To conduct our business in a responsible manner
- Information and awareness raising amongst the general population of the law and the message re. underage drinking
- Vocational education and training to ensure servers and sellers know the legislation and are appropriately equipped to follow the law
- Supporting the development of tools that can empower key influencers to act against underage drinking


Conclusions
