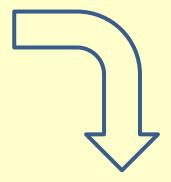
















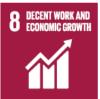
























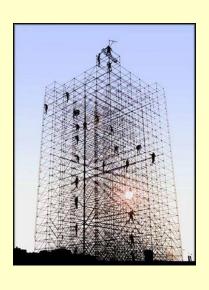








## **SDG-process**

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## Technical perspective

- SDGs use mostly absolute benchmarks
- They mix collective with country-specific targets
- Their feasibility/level of ambition varies
  - > Maternal mortality
  - > U5MR
  - Underweight

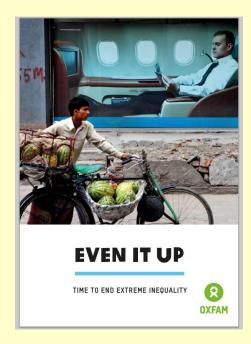


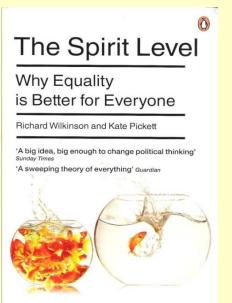


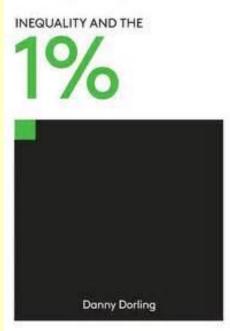


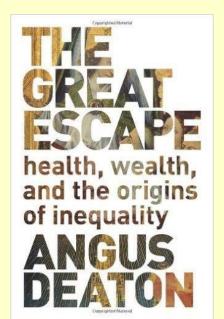


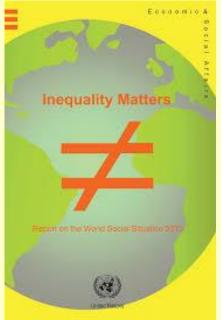






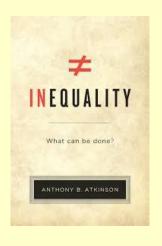






# ✓ Goal 10: Reduce inequality within and among countries

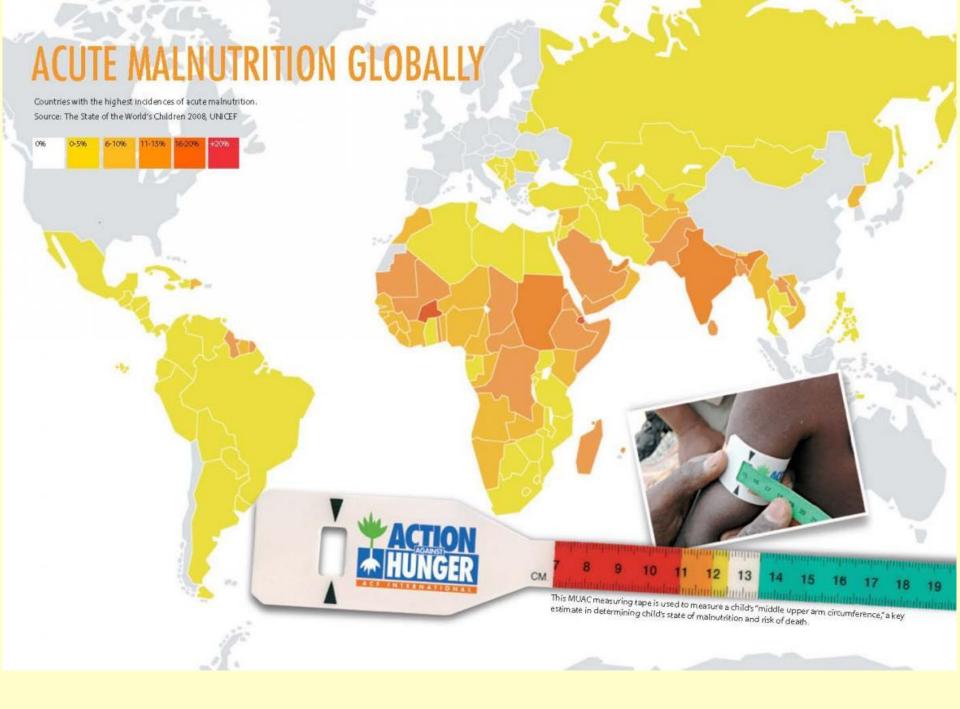
10.1: By 2030, progressively achieve and sustain income growth of the bottom 40 per cent of the population at a rate higher than the national average



"one of the themes of this book is that we need to consider the distribution as a whole"

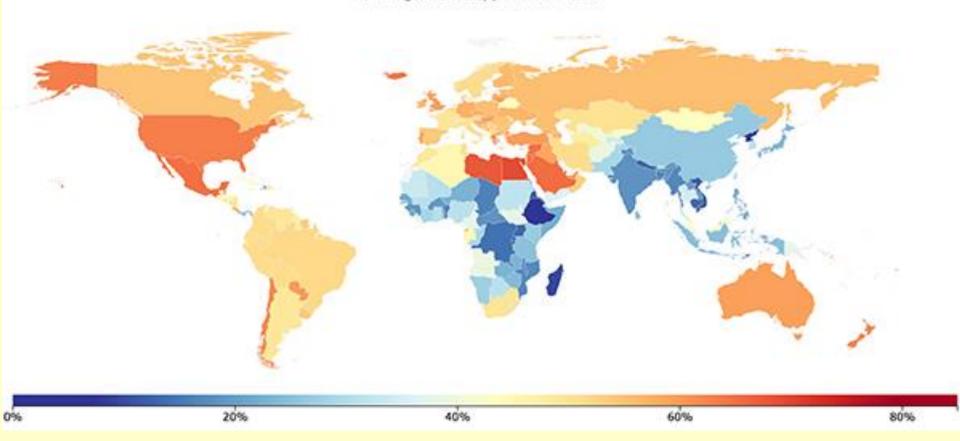
## SDGs: two major flaws
