



This privacy statement provides information about the processing and the protection of your personal data.

Processing operation: 2024 EU Health Policy Platform annual meeting

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1. Introduction

The European Commission is committed to protect your personal data and to respect your privacy. The Commission collects and further processes personal data pursuant to <u>Regulation</u> (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data.

This privacy statement explains the reason for the processing of your personal data in the context of the 2024 EU Health Policy Platform annual meeting. It explains the way we collect, handle and ensure protection of all personal data provided, how that information is used and what rights you have in relation to your personal data. It also specifies the contact details of the responsible Data Controller with whom you may exercise your rights, the Data Protection Officer and the European Data Protection Supervisor.

The information in relation to processing operation the 2024 EU Health Policy Platform annual meeting, undertaken by Unit SANTE B3 - Health monitoring and cooperation, Health networks, Directorate General for Health and Food Safety, European Commission of the European Commission, is presented below.

2. Why and how do we process your personal data?

<u>Purpose of the processing operation</u>: European Commission, DG SANTE, Unit B3 (Data Controller) collects and further processes your personal data to provide you with information about the 2024 EU Health Policy Platform annual meeting (before, during and after), to process your application for participation in that event and to disseminate the content of the event.

Live web-streaming and audio-visual recording at the 2024 EU Health Policy Platform annual meeting of the speakers, organisers and participants, as well as screenshots of the speakers and participants and organisers will be taken and published in the context of the annual meeting and other communication channels managed by DG SANTE such as EU Health Policy Platform, X, IntraComm, IntraSante, Public Health website, Luxweb and newsletters.

The audience or non-speaker participants may be photographed (screenshots) individually or in groups if they take the floor. They may also appear on panoramic photographs of the whole event/audience.

Participants that do not wish to be part of the above web-streaming and recording/publishing activities have the possibility to object to processing by turning off their webcameras or interacting with speakers and other participants through the webinar chat or Slido only.

3. On what legal ground(s) do we process your personal data?

The processing operations on personal data, linked to the organisation, management, follow-up and promotion of the 2024 EU Health Policy Platform annual meeting (including web-streaming, photos, audio-visual recording) are necessary for the management and functioning of the Commission, as mandated by the Treaties. Those provisions are in particular, Regulation (EU) No 282/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 11 March 2014 on the establishment of a third Programme for the Union's action in the field of health (2014-2020) Article 11 of the Treaty on European Union and Article 15 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union. Consequently, those processing operations are lawful under Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 (processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out

in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Union institution or body).

4. Which personal data do we collect and further process?

The following personal data will be processed:

 contact details (name of organisation, first name, last name, function/title, city, country, e-mail address, telephone number);

5. How long do we keep your personal data?

The Data Controller only keeps your personal data for the time necessary to fulfil the purpose of collection or further processing.

For each of the categories of personal data that is processed, please find below the retention details and the reference to the relevant record of processing:

- □ All personal data related to the organisation and management of the 2024 EU Health Policy Platform annual meeting (this includes the information given during the registration, before, during or after the event) will be deleted **five years** after the last action in relation to the 2024 EU Health Policy Platform annual meeting.
- Recordings from the web-streamed 2024 EU Health Policy Platform annual meeting will be kept for **5 years** before being deleted. More information is available in the Record of Processing DPR-EC-00306 (Web-streaming of Commission events).
- Personal data shared with the controller for future mailing purposes (e.g., for receiving newsletters or invitations to similar events) are processed in line with the Record of Processing DPR-EC-03928 on Management of subscriptions to receive information.

6. How do we protect and safeguard your personal data?

All personal data in electronic format (e-mails, documents, databases, uploaded batches of data, etc.) are stored either on the servers of the European Commission or Webex database authorised by the Commission. All processing operations are carried out pursuant to <u>Commission Decision (EU, Euratom) 2017/46</u> of 10 January 2017 on the security of communication and information systems in the European Commission.

In order to protect your personal data, the Commission has put in place a number of technical and organisational measures. Technical measures include appropriate actions to address online security, risk of data loss, alteration of data or unauthorised access, taking into consideration the risk presented by the processing and the nature of the personal data being processed. Organisational measures include restricting access to the personal data solely to authorised persons with a legitimate need to know for the purposes of this processing operation.

7. Who has access to your personal data and to whom is it disclosed?

Access to your personal data is provided to the Commission staff responsible for carrying out this processing operation and to other authorised Commission staff according to the "need to

know" principle. Such staff abide by statutory, and when required, additional confidentiality agreements.

Where necessary, we may also share your information with service providers for the purposes of organising the 2024 EU Health Policy Platform annual meeting.

Third party IT tools, including Social Media

We use third party IT tools to inform about and promote the 2024 EU Health Policy Platform annual meeting through widely used communication channels, including the social media. For detailed information about the use of social media by the European Commission, see the Record of Processing DPR-EC-00073 (Social Media Use by the European Commission).

You can watch our videos, which we also share and upload to our @EU_Health X account, DG SANTE Vimeo account, Public Health website and the EU Health Policy Platform.

In order to protect your privacy, our use of third party IT tools to connect to those services does not set cookies when our website pages are loaded on your computer (or other devices), nor are you immediately redirected to those social media or other websites. Only in the event that you click on a button or "play" on a video to watch it, a cookie of the social media company concerned will be installed on your device. If you do not click on any social media buttons or videos, no cookies will be installed on your device by third parties.

In order to view such third-party content on our websites, a message will alert you that you need to accept those third parties' specific Terms and Conditions, including their cookie policies, over which the Commission has no control.

We recommend that users read the relevant privacy policies carefully before using them. These explain each company's policy of personal data collection and further processing, their use of data, users' rights and the ways in which users can protect their privacy when using those services.

The use of a third party IT tool does not in any way imply that the European Commission endorses them or their privacy policies. In the event that one or more third party IT tools are occasionally unavailable, we accept no responsibility for lack of service due to their downtime.

8. What are your rights and how can you exercise them?

You have specific rights as a 'data subject' under Chapter III (Articles 14-25) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, in particular the right to access, your personal data and to rectify them in case your personal data are inaccurate or incomplete. Where applicable, you have the right to erase your personal data, to restrict the processing of your personal data, to object to the processing, and the right to data portability.

You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data, which is lawfully carried out pursuant to Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 on grounds relating to your particular situation (see above under point 2).

You can exercise your rights by contacting the data controller, or in case of conflict the Data Protection Officer. If necessary, you can also address the European Data Protection Supervisor. Their contact information is given under Heading 9 below.
