- Adequate coverage of thematic priorities

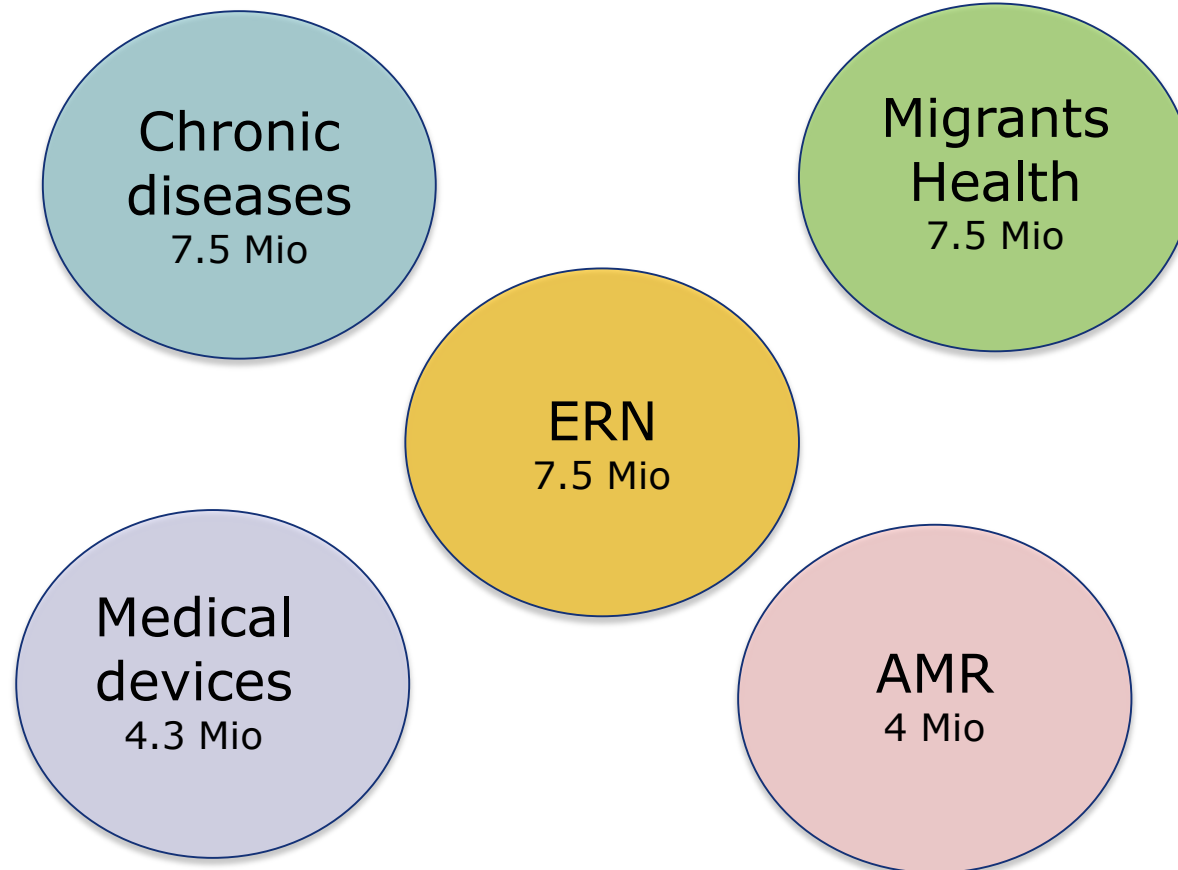

Support for the health workforce planning and forecasting expert network

This action will contribute to the sustainability of the health workforce through expertise and knowledge sharing and support anticipation of skills needs to tap into the health sector's job creation potential.

Building on the previous work of the Joint Action for health workforce planning and forecasting, the activities to be addressed include:

- (i) organising three expert network meetings** to exchange knowledge in the area of health workforce planning and forecasting and providing a forum for peer support to resolve health workforce challenges;
- (ii) updating information** on national health workforce strategies **and further analysis on skills needs** in the health sector;
- (iii) maintaining and updating the website** on health workforce planning and policies.
