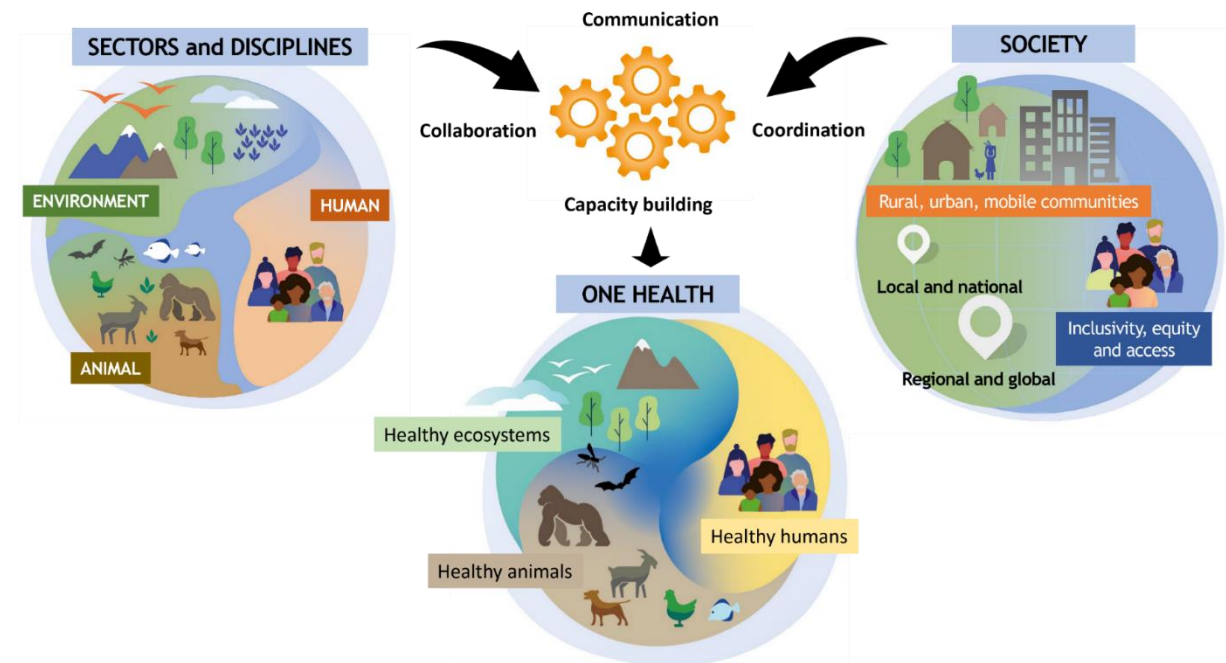

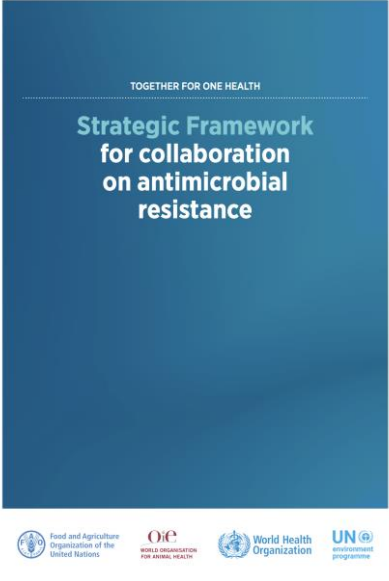
Strategic Framework for collaboration on AMR

The goal is **to preserve antimicrobial efficacy and ensure sustainable and equitable access to antimicrobials for responsible and prudent use in human, animal and plant health, contributing to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).**

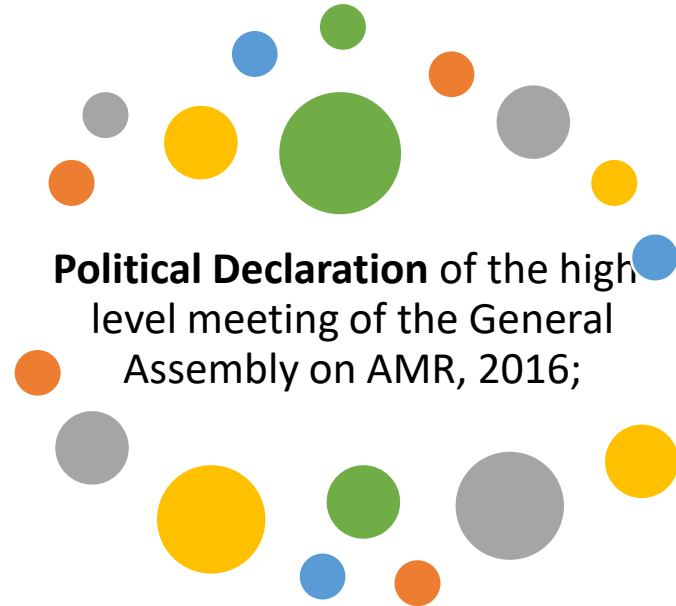
To achieve this goal, the **objectives** of the four organizations are to:

OBJECTIVE 1 Optimize the production and use of antimicrobials along the whole life cycle from research and development to disposal; and	OBJECTIVE 2 Decrease the incidence of infection in humans, animals, and plants to reduce the development and spread of AMR.

Quadripartite collaboration on AMR



- Countries recognized the **need to scale up efforts to address AMR globally**;
- Countries **committed to support a multisectoral One Health approach to address AMR including through innovative public-private partnerships**;
- **WHO, FAO and WOA** mandated to **work together** to support global and country action to address AMR; **UNEP** joined the Tripartite in April 2022.

In 2019, IACG recommended the *“establishment of a **constituency-based partnership platform** facilitated and managed by the Tripartite agencies with diverse representation”*

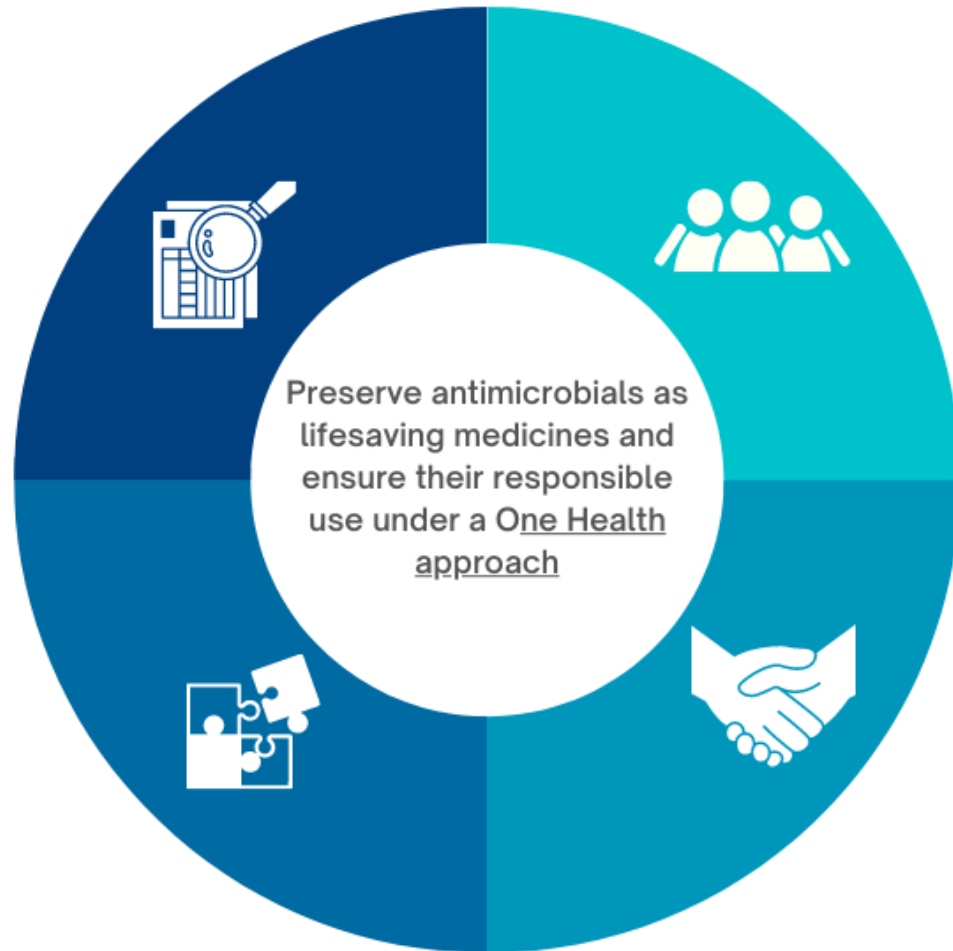

FAO Director-General calls for action at global conference



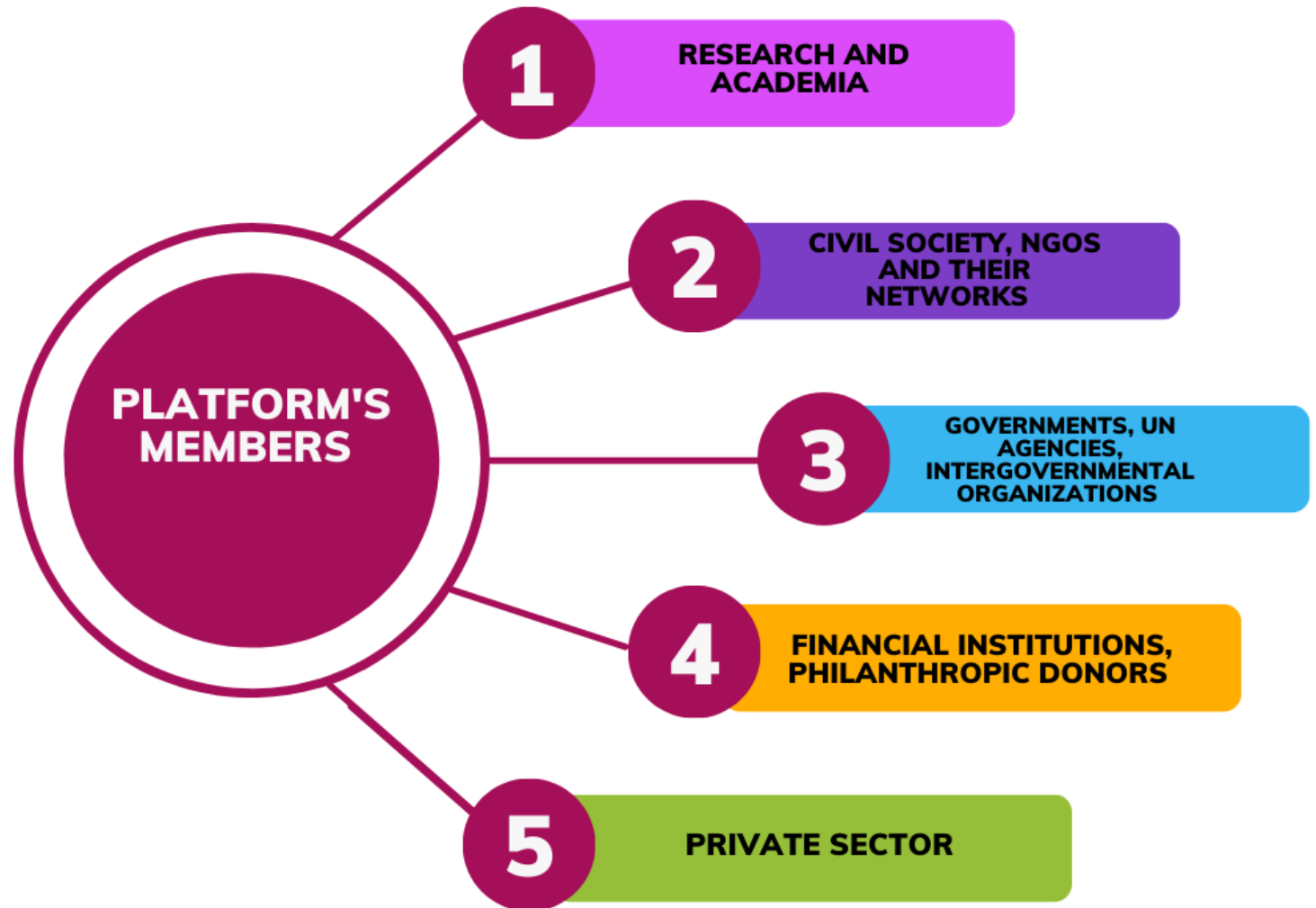
- 18 Nov 2022 - Virtual launch at the World Antimicrobial Awareness Week - 500 participants;

- Presented in the **Third High-Level Ministerial Conference on AMR**; acknowledged in the Muscat Manifesto;
- Platform established with the support of the European Commission (DG SANTE);
- DG SANTE holds the Observer Status in the Platform's Steering Committee

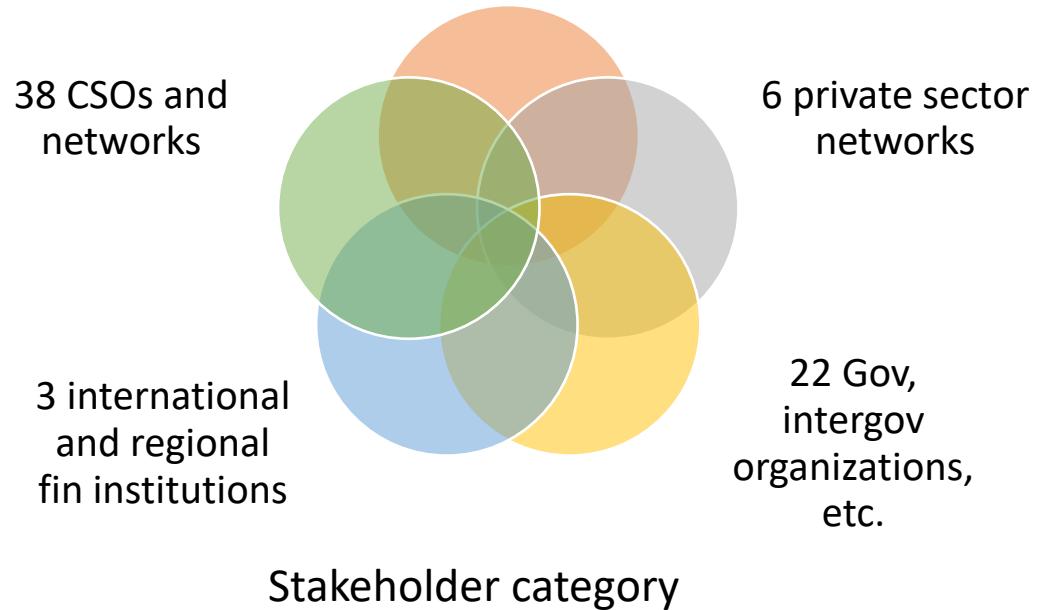

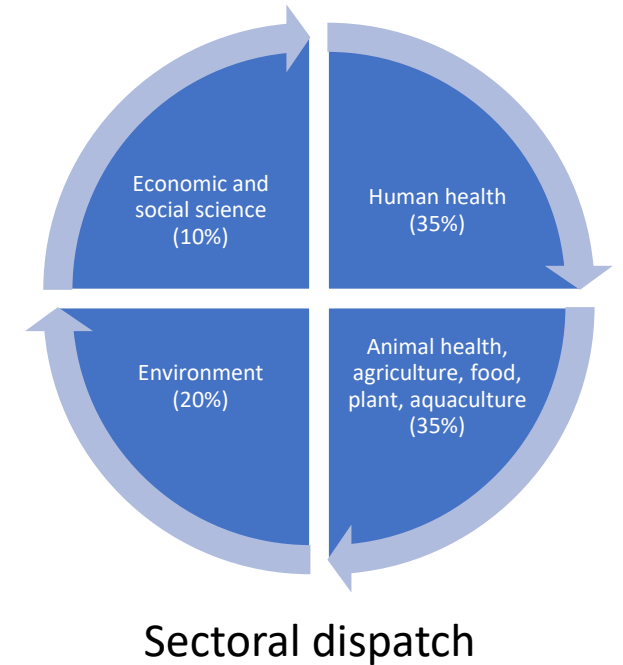
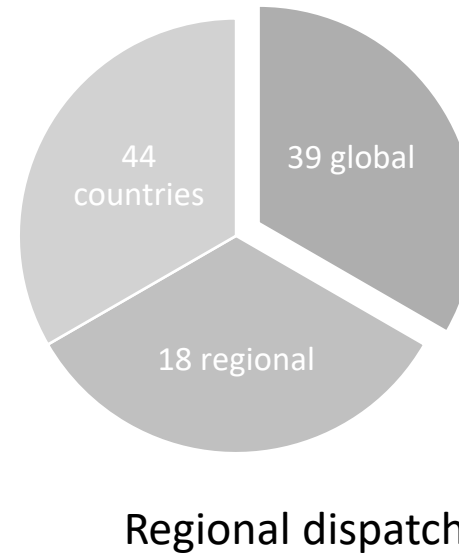


Membership snapshot

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More than 120 member organizations

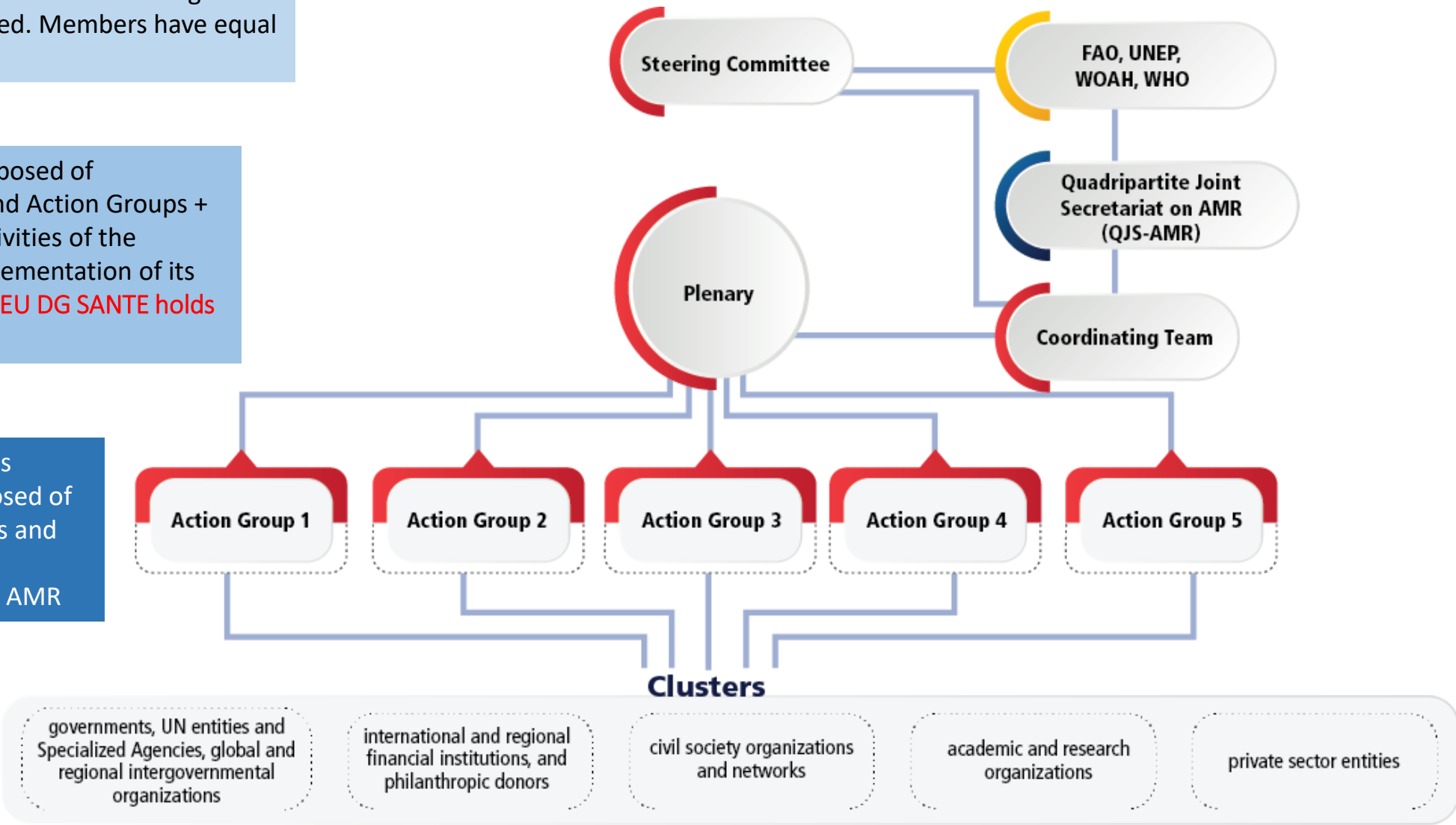
How do members work together?

The **Plenary** is the highest Platform's forum for Member's dialogue, coordination and exchange of best practices and lessons learned. Members have equal voice.

The **Steering Committee** is composed of representatives from Clusters and Action Groups + QpT. The SC coordinates the activities of the Platform and facilitates the implementation of its priorities, plans, and proposals. **EU DG SANTE holds the status of observer.**

Action Groups are the Platform's executive arms. They are composed of Members from different Clusters and aim to identify, implement, and monitor roadmaps for action on AMR

Members are designated into **five Clusters** to ensure broad representation across One Health spectrum.

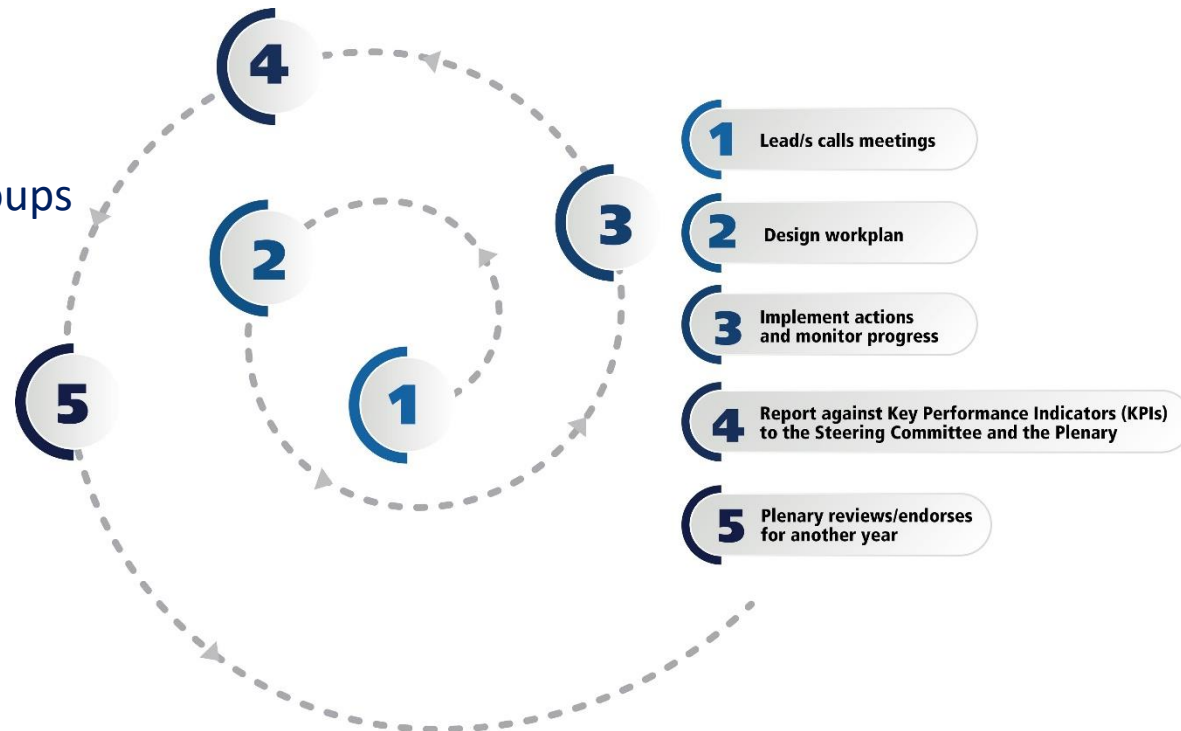


Driving collective action – Action Groups

Work process within Action Groups

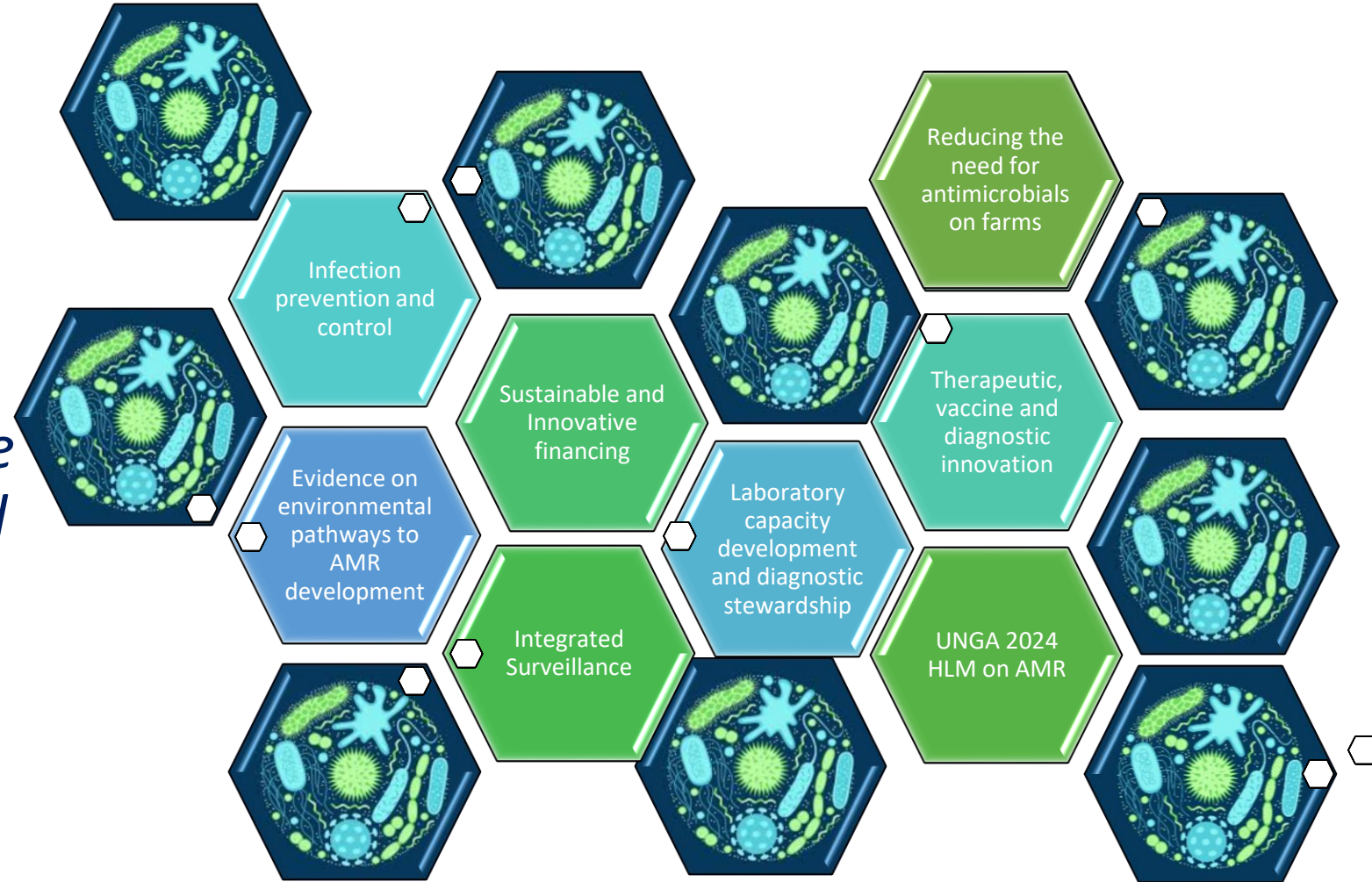


• Key features:

- **Bottom-up approach** – members propose topics for Action Groups based on their priorities and areas of interest;
- **Self-organized, self-driven and self-funded;**
- Report annually to Plenary and Steering Committee
- **Have one representative in the Steering Committee;**
- Incorporate new members at any time;
- Observers can participate in accordance with the Qpt rules, policies and regulations;

Possible priorities for the first Action Groups

- *Be in the spirit of One Health*
- *Deliver action*
- *Leverage innovative ideas, solutions and partnerships*
- *18 proposals received*



How to join?

Membership of countries

'One country - one Member'

Governments should appoint a representative at a level they consider appropriate and an alternate to represent the government in the Platform and coordinate the work of the country delegation in the Platform

Governments can compose a delegation from several ministries and other government entities working on AMR at the national and decentralized levels. This delegation can participate in the Platform's Plenary, Action Groups and other operating mechanisms of the Platform.

Membership of civil society, private sector, research and academia

Membership of entities/organizations (not individuals)

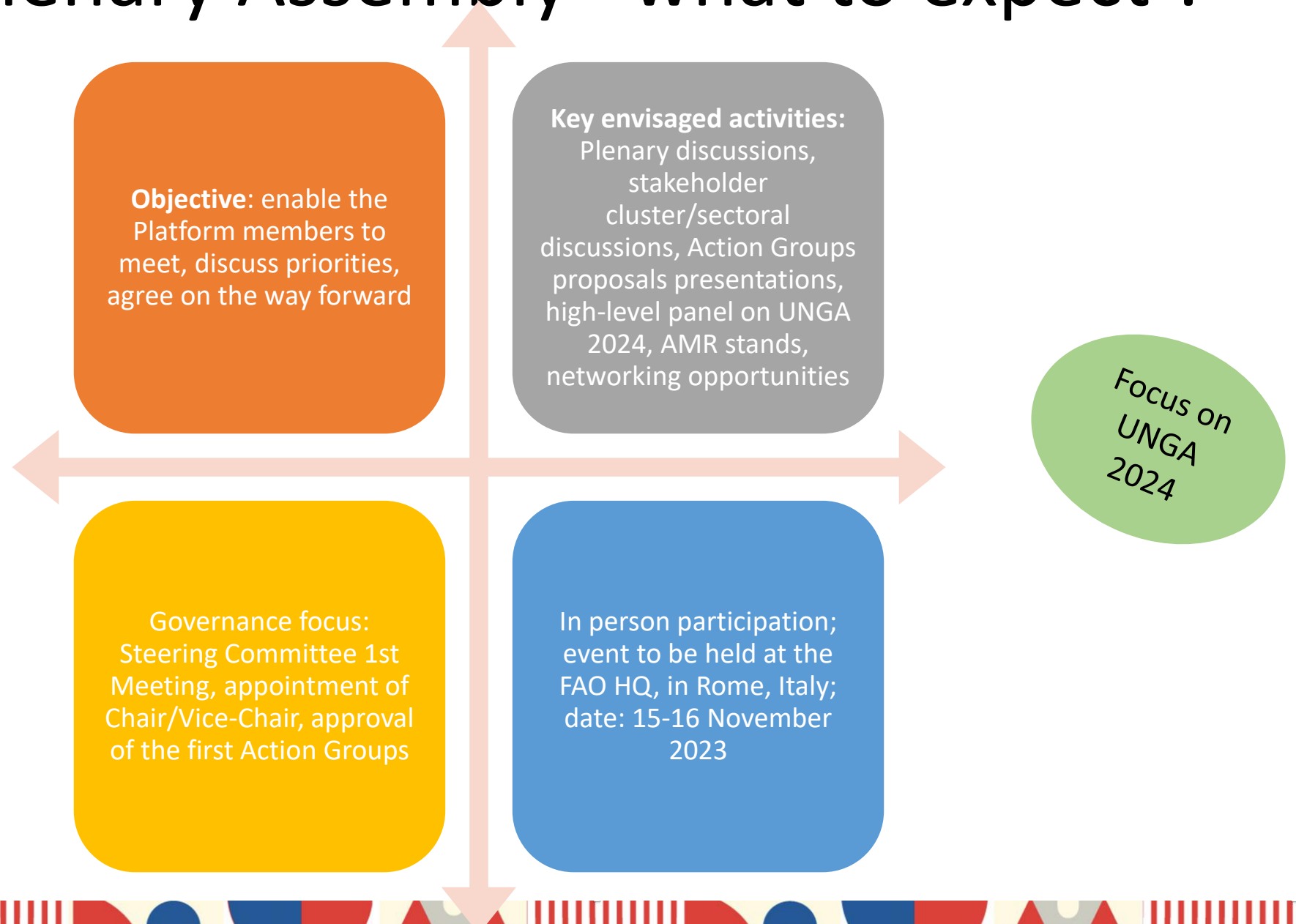
Members should appoint a representative at a level they consider appropriate and an alternate to represent the organization in the Platform

Organizations can compose a delegation from several people (technical staff) who would be involved in the work of the Platform (Action Groups, Clusters, etc)

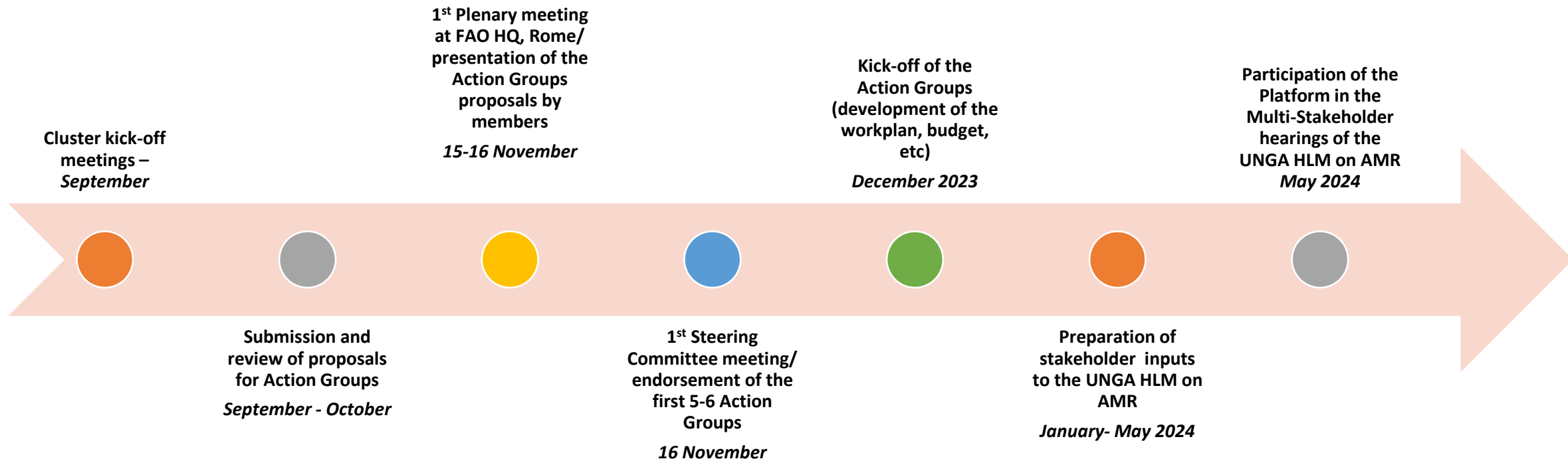
Private sectors networks can become members; they will undergo a due diligence review procedure
