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Cancer Registry Data Call – 2015/2016

Background

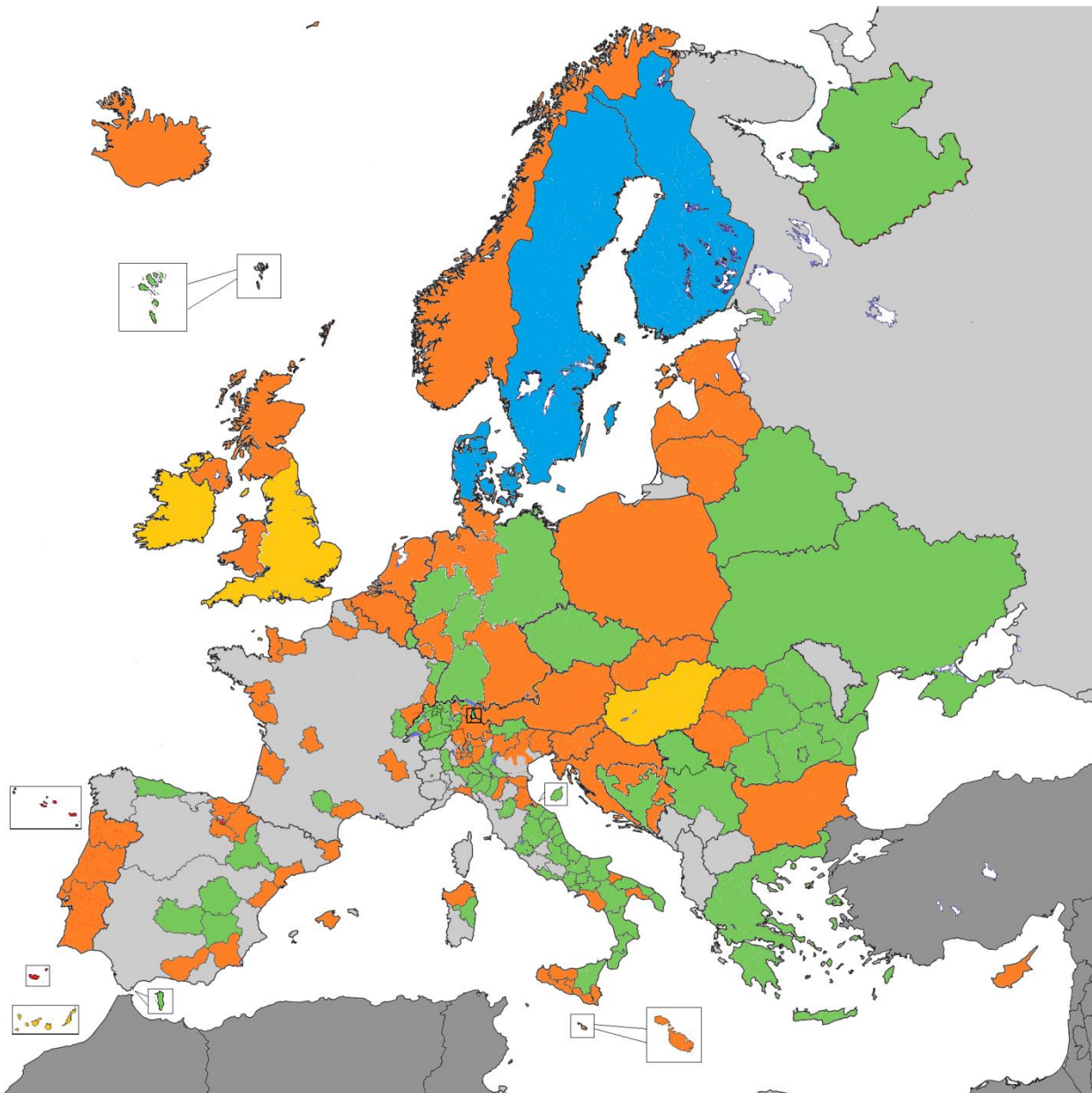
The European Commission's Directorate General Joint Research Centre, on request of DG SANTE, took over responsibility of European Cancer Registry data collection in 2013.

Previously, European cancer **incidence** and **mortality** statistics published on a 5-year basis (coinciding with IARC's Cancer Incidence in 5 Continents study – CI5). Statistics consequently five-years out-of-date.

Survival statistics traditionally provided by the EURO CARE study – independent call for data and data-cleaning process.

 **Aim:** to streamline data-collection process and where possible to reduce time lag – **continually open data submission** with "**data-brokering**" type of service as well as provision of **harmonised data-cleaning tools**.

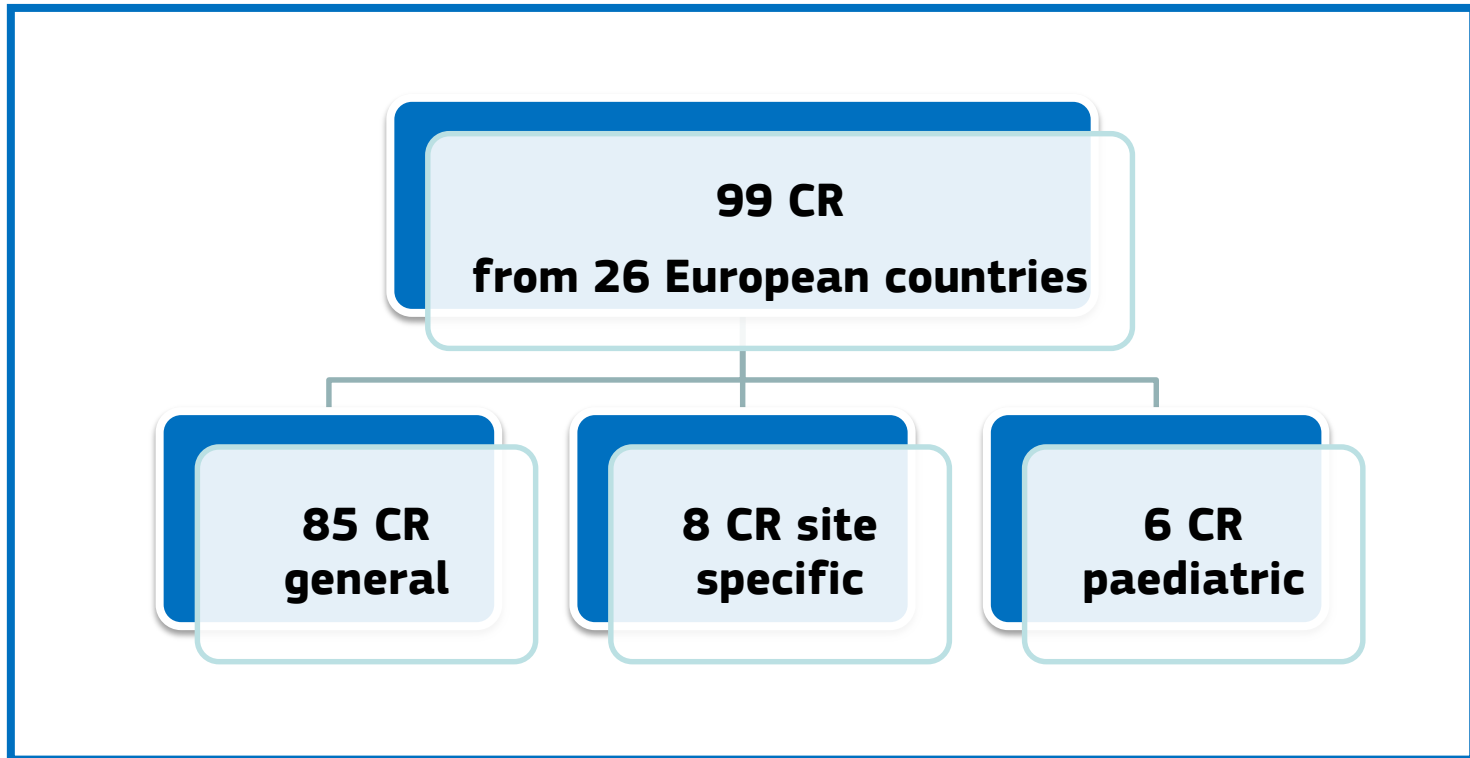
Cancer Registries – status of 2016 data submission



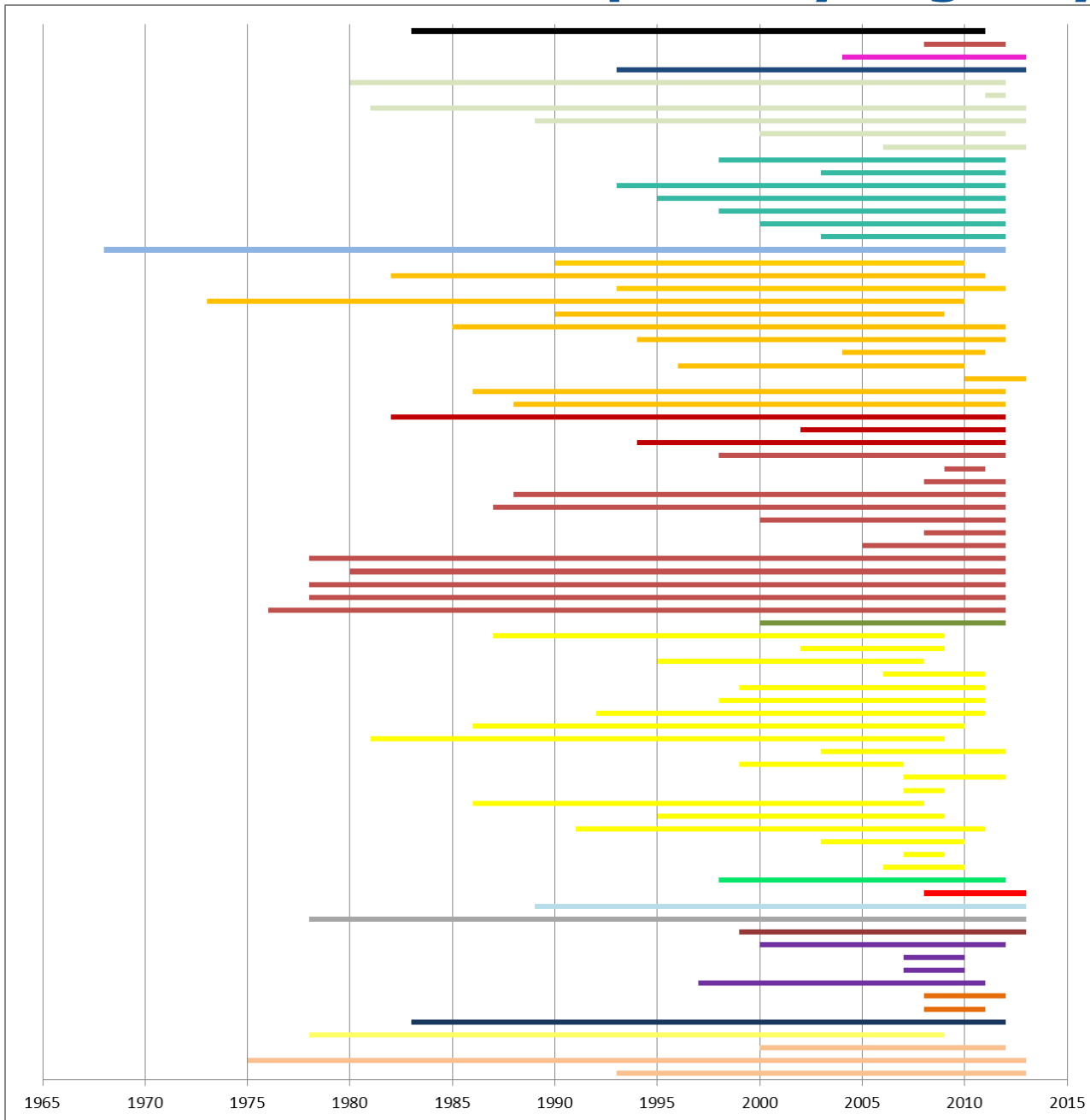
