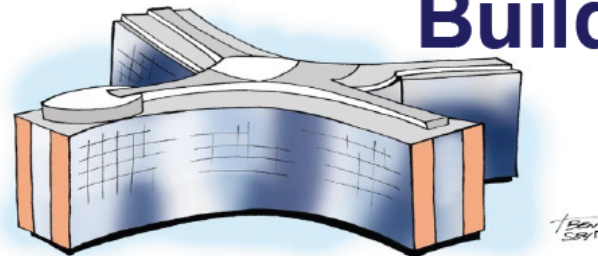

Public Procurement is the purchasing of works, supplies and services by public bodies.

The legal basis for the Commission and Chafea's procurement is laid down in the **Financial Regulation** and its **rules of application**.

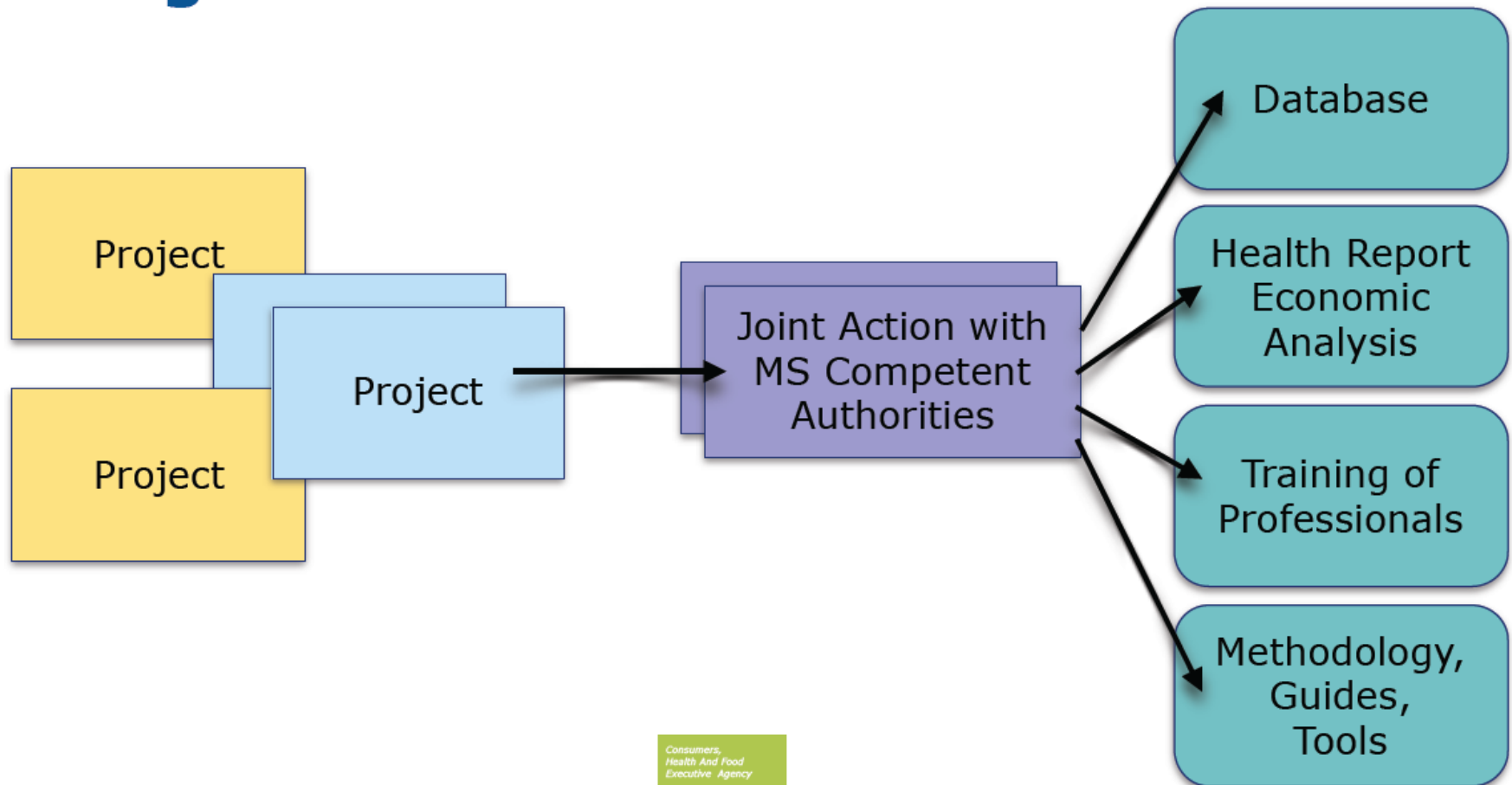

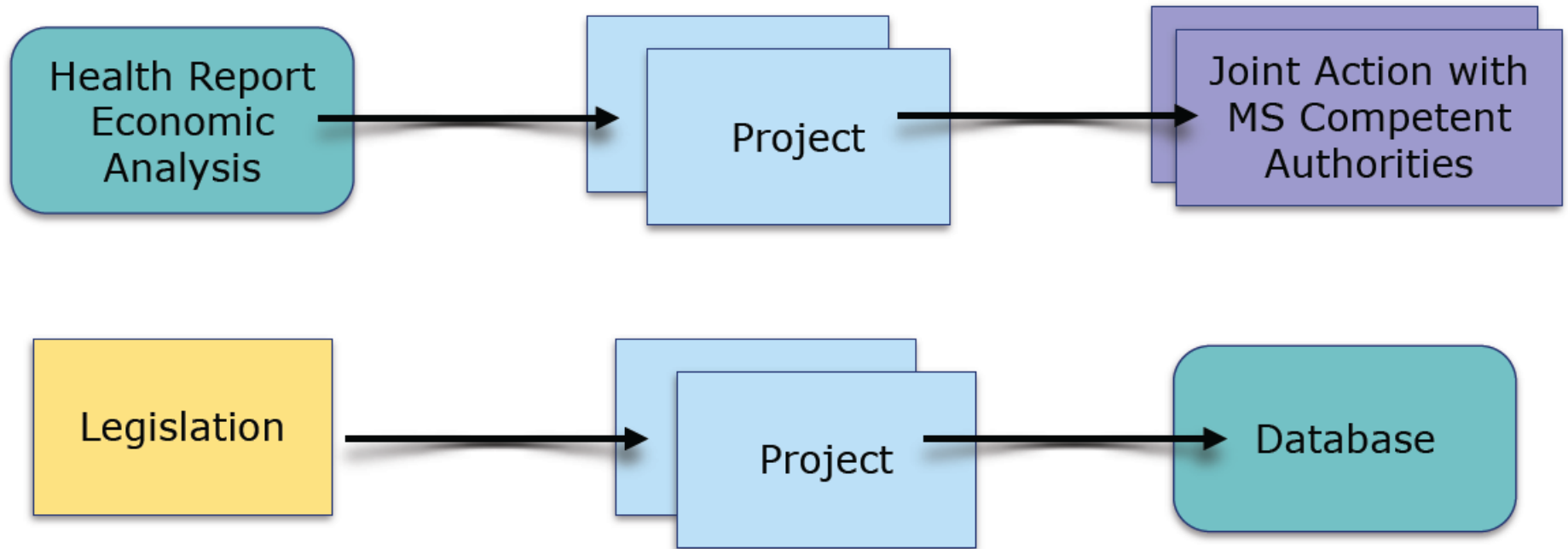
Service Contract (Procurement) vs. Project Grant

To acquire a product or a service.	Purpose	To encourage actions indicated in the Work Plan, which fall primarily within the scope of the beneficiary's activities
Call for tender	Procedure	Call for proposals
Service Contract	Legal outcome	Grant Agreement
The EU pays 100 % of the contract price	EU financial contribution	EU-contribution to the overall costs (Co-funding)
Since the service or product has been purchased and paid for by the EU, in general it belongs to the EU in its entirety	Ownership	The ownership as a rule is vested in the beneficiary of the grant.
The operator's remuneration should include an element of profit.	Profit	The grant must not have the purpose or the effect of producing a profit for the beneficiary.

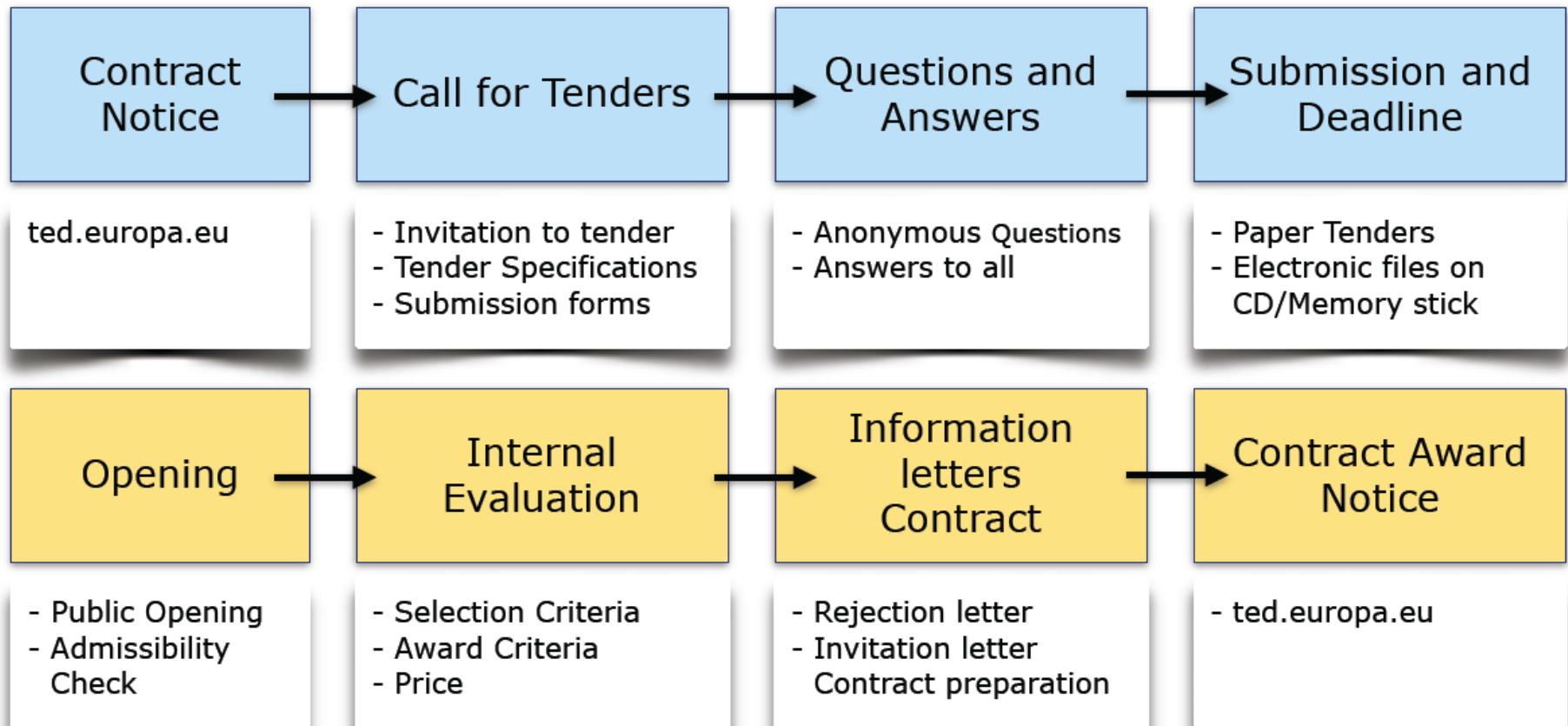

At the request of economic operators via TED eTendering, the contracting authority may supply additional information for the purpose of clarifying the procurement documents;

On its own initiative, the contracting authority may inform interested parties if it spots any error, inaccuracy, omission or other clerical error in the procurement documents.

Who can participate?

Natural and legal persons from:

- The 28 Member States of the European Union

Certain non EU countries as follows:

- With special agreement in the field of public procurement with the EU
- Under the Stabilisation and Association Agreements (FYROM, Albania, Montenegro, Serbia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo)
- European Economic Area (Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein)
- GPA Parties (only in case of inter-institutional procurement)

Types of tenderer:

- Single tenderer
- Single Tenderer with Subcontractor
- **Consortium**
- **Consortium with Subcontractor**

Joint tenderers

The offer shall clearly specify the role and tasks of each member of the group:

- The **leader of the group**: with full authority to bind the consortium and each of its members
- Each partner shall fulfil the requirements and accept the terms and conditions set out in the TS, the contract as well as in all the relevant Annexes.

In case the tender is awarded the contract:

all members of the consortium will be jointly and severally liable towards the contracting authority for the performance of the contract.

Subcontracting

- Tenderers are required to identify subcontractors according to TS
- Identified subcontractors must submit letters of intent
- Change of subcontractor during implementation requires prior written approval by the contracting authority
- Rules on access to the market do not apply to subcontractors

The offer has to be sent to Chafea by registered mail or by courier post mail, in a sealed packet containing the 3 envelopes, before the date of deadline.

No obligation to award the contract

- Up to the point of signature, CHAFEA may cancel the procurement procedure without the tenderers being entitled to claim any compensation.
- Chafea shall not be liable for any compensation with respect to tenderers whose tenders have not been accepted, not shall it be liable when deciding not to award the contract.

Specifics

- Transparent economic operation
- Owner of the outcome is EU/EC
- Tender specifications are "specific", offer must comply in detail
- Pre-existing rights need to be transferable
- Payment of an agreed price against invoice, no prefinancing
- Contractor can make profit/loss
- European Commission Visual Identity for publications
- 1 up to many partners, also
- Paper submission, Paper contract, paper invoice.

Purpose:

The EU dimension of alcohol related harm addressing the main challenges on alcohol related harm, lowering alcohol consumption and preventing alcohol abuse.

- To identify data gaps and further work on data and evidence and advice contributing to the reduction of alcohol related harm.

AWP 2017 4.5.3 Framework Contract concerning the Health reports and economic analysis (**under preparation**)

Purpose:

- The objective of this action is to produce information, in the form of reports and economic analysis, which is needed at short notice to support the development or implementation of policies or legislation and the evaluation of the effects of policy implementation.
- Health reports ought to provide well-structured and sound information on topical issues for EU citizens, stakeholders and policy-makers. Economic analysis will provide information on health and health-related phenomena serving as sound evidence for policy-making.

AWP 2017 Chafea/2017/Health/03 concerning a feasibility study for an monitoring system on food reformulation initiatives for salt, sugars and fat

Purpose:

This project/study intends to pilot test the functioning of the monitoring system in key areas. The contractor shall perform a feasibility analysis (usefulness, cost, sustainability) of further actions to standardise and harmonise related data collection and to allow for direct comparisons that are currently not possible (from many points of view, e.g.: age groups, methods of dietary assessment, different food composition databases).

AWP 2018 - 4.1. Support to Member States in reducing alcohol related harm

Purpose:

- implementation of **best practices for early screening and brief interventions** as identified by the Joint Action on reducing alcohol-related harm and supported by evidence (e.g. from the OECD and WHO);
- implementation of **best practices for activities in schools** as identified by the Joint Action on reducing alcohol-related harm and supported by evidence;
- implementation of **best practices for public communication and awareness campaigns** as identified by the Joint Action on reducing alcohol-related harm;
- support to **capacity building**, sharing and implementing of best practices in the Member States, including via scientific networks, organising job shadowing, missions and knowledge transfer;
- organisation of **thematic meetings** focused on the above specific working areas and deliverables. The work would support and strengthen the work of Member States by facilitating a focus on the development of agreed deliverables and results.

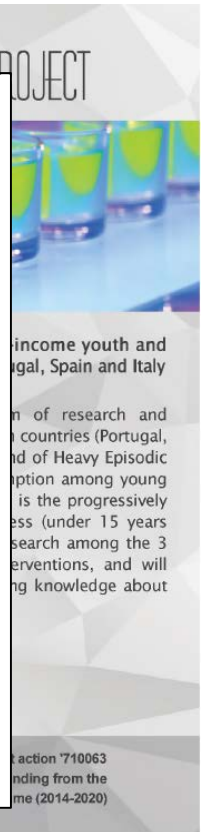

STAD in Europe (SIE)



Reducing binge drinking and its negative consequences, through restricting the availability of alcohol in different drinking environments (based on the STAD (Stockholm prevents alcohol and drug problems) approach).

1. Development of 7 tailor-made interventions (one in each participating country) to restrict the availability of alcohol;
2. Implementation of the 7 interventions in the 7 pilot regions
3. Conducting a process and outcome evaluation on both development and implementation of the 7 interventions
4. Developing a digital manual including the four intervention models and implementation strategies to restrict the availability of alcohol in nightlife settings
5. Dissemination of gathered knowledge among all EU MS

What is the STAD in Europe project?

The STAD in Europe (SiE) project aims to tackle heavy episodic drinking by using the main components of STAD: – community mobilization – training in responsible beverage service – stricter enforcements. Besides nightlife, the SiE project also focusses on festivals, home drinking and drinking in streets and parks.

What's in it for me?

This project will result in a digital manual for local policy makers with guidelines, tips and tricks on how to implement a STAD-based prevention strategy in local settings. In the spring of 2018 the manual will be presented on a SiE symposium and will be available on our website.

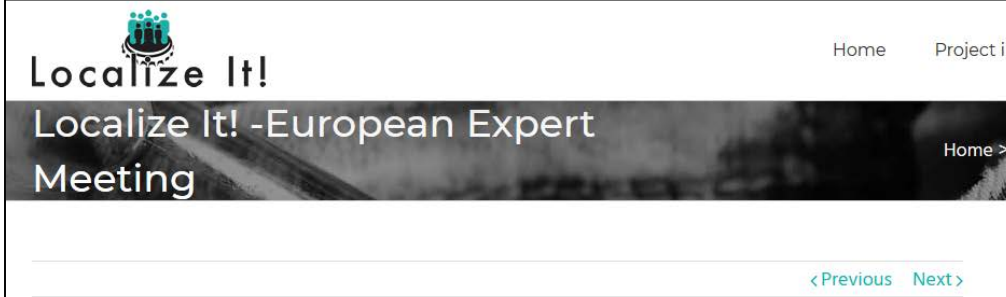

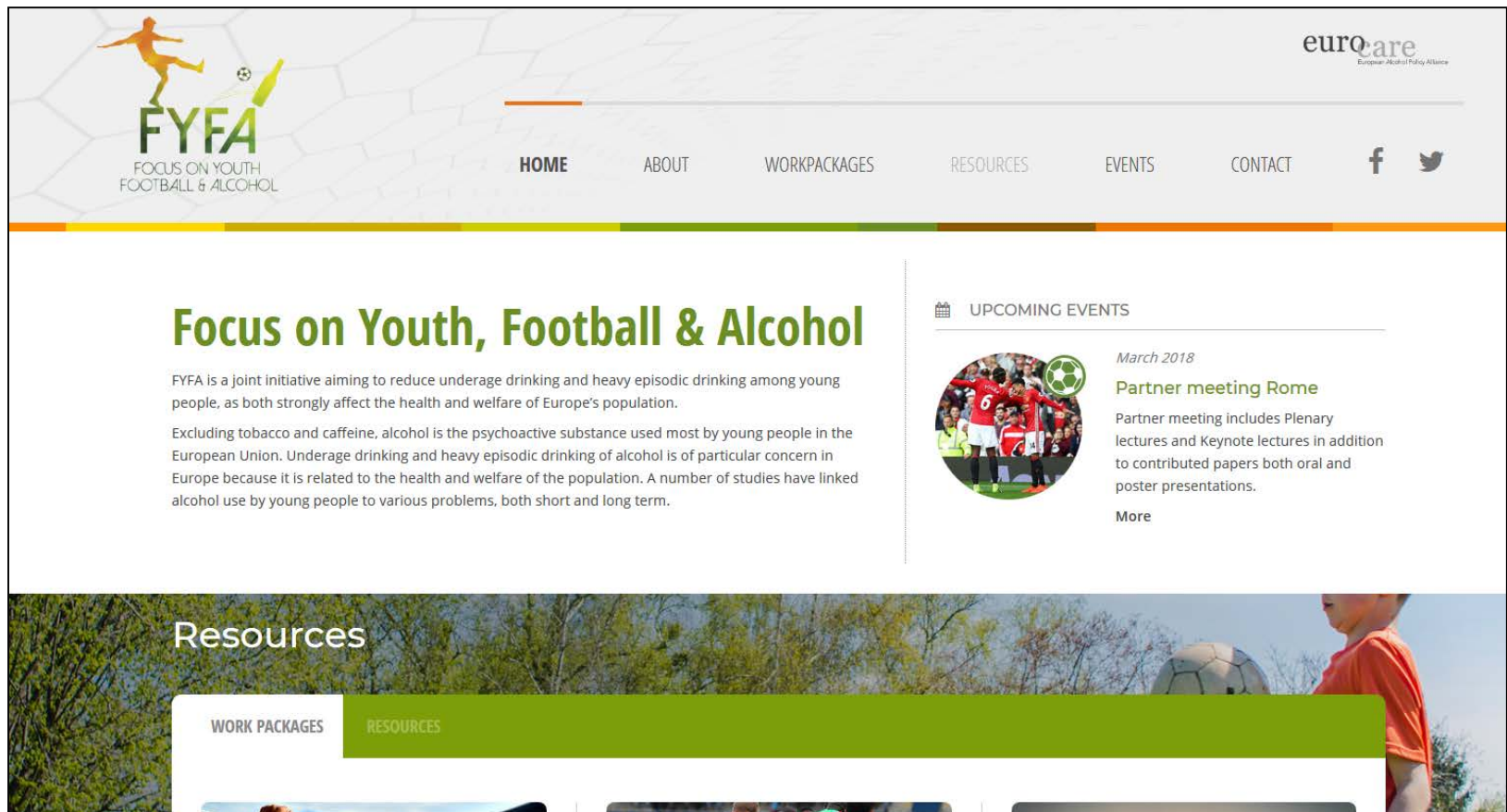
Within the Localize It! project, a European Expert Meeting will take place in **Muenster, Germany** from **13-14 March 2018**.
