For the implementation of the BPR, a new legislation has been drafted and published on 14 March 2014: The Biocides Law of 2014. This law lays down, among other issues, the rules for the enforcement of the BPR as described below:

A) The scope of the law is:

- To establish the necessary measures for the implementation of the Regulation (EU) No 528/2012,
- to establish the general provisions and rules concerning:
  - i) the process of authorising biocidal products,
  - ii) the marketing and distribution of biocidal products to the user,
  - iii) the official controls of the placing of biocidal products on the market and their use,
  - iv) the penalties imposed on violators of this Law (Administrative sanctions and administrative fines up to €5.000,00, according to the nature, severity and duration of the infringement, penalties after criminal prosecution - 2 years imprisonment and/or €20.000,00 fine).

B) The law also includes the powers granted to inspectors, prohibition provisions etc.
