






Primary Health Care Units in Austria

Implementation project following health care reform in Austria aiming to provide integrated, patient-centred care




- Start-up guide for GPs setting up their own primary health care unit

Country focus ingrained across the service








Technical Support Projects on Health (2015 - 2019)


NUMBER OF SRSS HEALTHCARE PROJECTS

A new programme after 2020

The Commission has proposed to expand the work of the SRSS after 2020 under a new Reform Support Programme, with a much bigger overall budget of €25 billion.

The proposed programme would have three strands.

- Reform delivery tool €22 billion
 Financial incentives for governments to implement structural reforms addressing key challenges identified every year as part of the 'European Semester'.
- Technical support instrument just under
 €1 billion
 Continued help for governments to design and implement reforms and optimise their administrative capacity.
- Convergence facility just over €2 billion
 Financial and technical support to those countries that have taken demonstrable steps towards joining the euro.
