1. WELCOME AND APOLOGIES

2. ADOPTION OF THE DRAFT AGENDA

The draft agenda was adopted as proposed

3. DECLARATION OF INTEREST ON MATTERS ON THE AGENDA

Prof. P Calow declared a possible conflict of interest in relation to item 7.3 since he was involved in the environment steering committee of NiPERA (Nickel Producers Environmental Research Association).

Prof. Janssen declared possible conflict of interest in relation to item 7.3, being member of the NiPERA risk assessment peer review group.

4. Approval of the draft minutes of the 3rd SCHER plenary meeting

The minutes of the 3rd SCHER plenary meeting were adopted.

5. CHAIR'S AND COMMISSION REPORT

5.1 ICCG October 2009

The chair reminded to the Committee tasks and functioning of the Scientific Committees and expected attendance and preparation for the meetings.

The Committee was informed on the revised rules on special indemnities and the revision and the approval of the Rules of Procedure foreseen during the following Chairs meeting of November.

The Committee was also briefly informed on the organization and participation of members in the Chairs meeting session on alternative methods and the risk assessment day of 20 November.

6. New requests for opinions by Commission services on:

6.1 Risks/benefits assessment and the optimization of Risk Assessment in relation to Risk Managers' needs (DG SANCO)

Following a proposal from SCHER and agreed with DG SANCO, the ICCG also agreed that a joint working group of the three Committees should be established in order to produce an opinion on this issue.

6.2 Risk from organic CMR substances in polymeric toy materials (DG ENTR)

The representative of DG ENTR introduced the mandate to the Committee. The aim of the mandate is to establish a sound scientific basis for setting safe limits for the presence of organic CMR substances in toys.

6.3 Risk from the use of diantimony trioxide in toys (DG ENTR)

DG ENTR requested a scientific opinion on the risk to the health from the presence of diantimony trioxide in toys.

In particular, on the basis of the available scientific information, the mandate requested whether the presence of diantimony trioxide in toys would pose a risk to the health of children. The aim of the request of DG ENTR is to evaluate the exemption of the CMR ban for the use of diantimony trioxide (DAT) in toys.

A Rapporteur was appointed to prepare a draft opinion to be circulated to the WG on CMR in toys and discussed at the next plenary
