Has the ICPD PoA helped advance the cause of SRHR?

- Historical importance for SRHR
- Powerful advocacy tool
- Influence on domestic policies
- Strengthened financial support for SRHR
- Has put family planning & SRHR on the agenda

BUT!

- Has the reality matched the theory?
- The influence of the opposition













Survey - Question 4

Could the EU support a new global consensus on SRHR that is as strong as the ICPD PoA?

- 2 great challenges at present:
 - o Political opposition
 - o Global economic downturn
- 2 opportunities within EU:
 - o Making silent countries speak!
 - o Winning over opposition
- Importance of NGOs' role
- Forging alliances with USA & developing world
- Need for strong leadership at UN level (UNFPA, UN Women)













Outlook

What is going to happen?

- SRHR political framework is likely to be dispersed across many sectors and settings
- Will SRHR be sidelined at the cost of new focus areas (climate change, population ageing, communicable diseases)?
- Which place for SRHR in new development policy framework focusing on inclusive growth and leverage of funding?













Outlook

What influence will the indefinite prolongation of the ICPD PoA have?

- Do we lose specialised & focused SRHR framework that was afforded to it by the ICPD PoA through its indefinite prolongation?
- Is there enough political will to make progress on certain issues (such as unsafe abortion, youth SRHR & sexuality education) after loss of clear end date?
- Hunger exists for framework to discuss future of SRHR & make progress, but what kind of framework should it be?
- Specific concentration on unfinished ICPD PoA agenda? Merging ICPD PoA and MDGs in MDG+ framework?
