One Health action plan

“One Health”

Integrated

Comprehensive

Recognizing that the main impact of antimicrobial resistance is on human health, but that both the contributing factors and the consequences, including economic and others, go beyond health, and that there is a need for a coherent, comprehensive and integrated approach at global, regional and national levels, in a “One Health” approach and beyond, involving different actors and sectors such as human and veterinary medicine, agriculture, finance, environment and consumers.

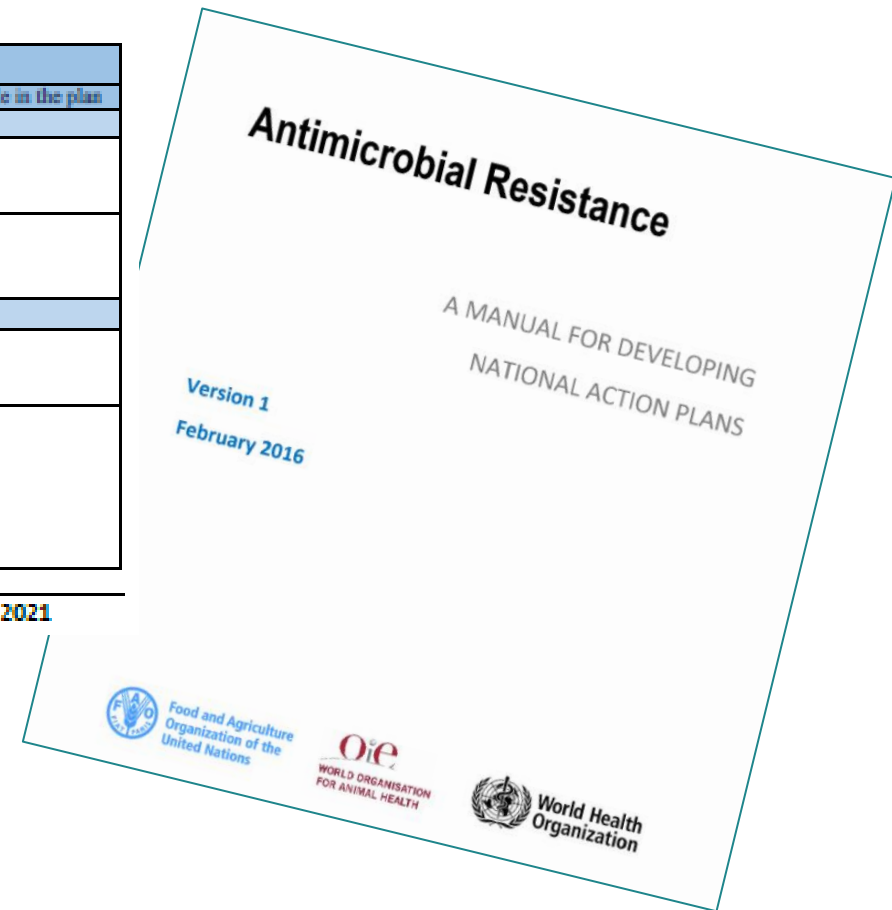

Review


- Documentary review of NAPs (not implementation)
 - Reflects mostly content of the NAPs
- Member States at different points in their work to combat AMR
- Not all Member States have a One Health plan (only sectoral plans)

Limitations / challenges

NAPs

- **Different approaches**

- Different patterns of antimicrobial usage
 - Different objectives, actions and measures
- Level of development of AMR work at national level
 - First OH NAPs versus those with mainly priority (remaining) actions

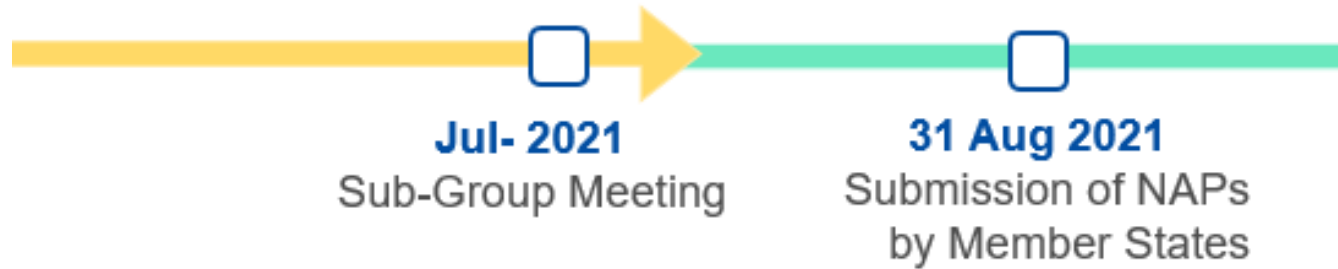

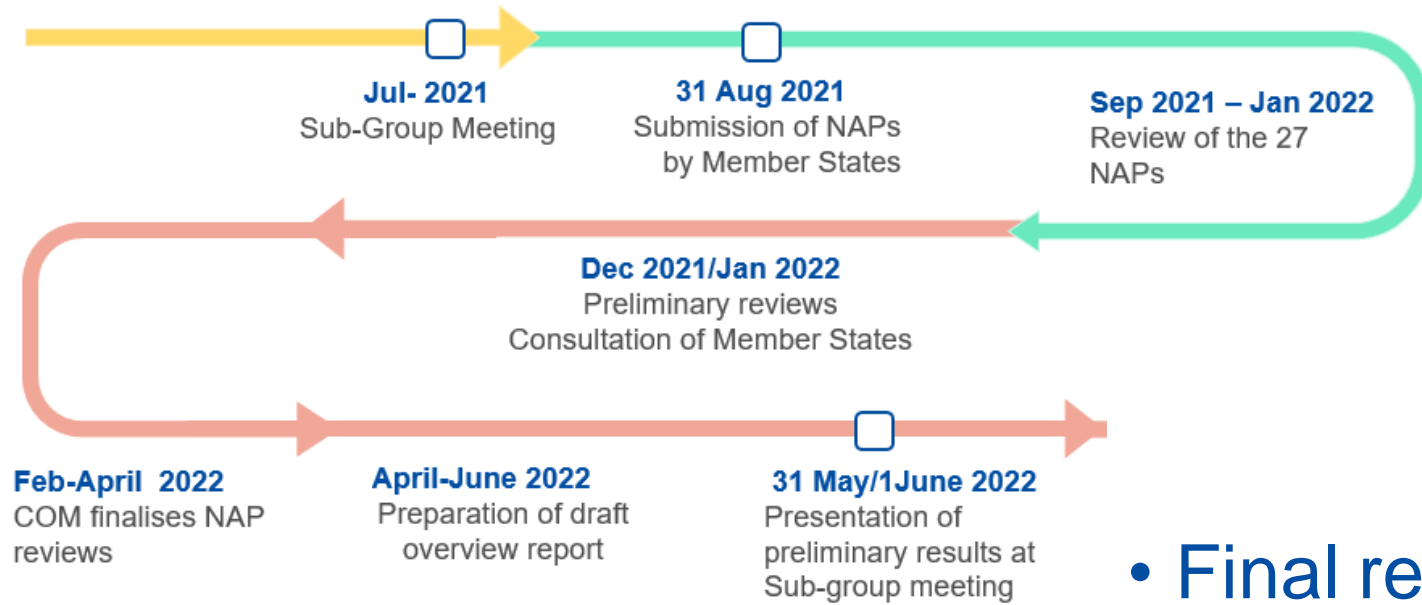
