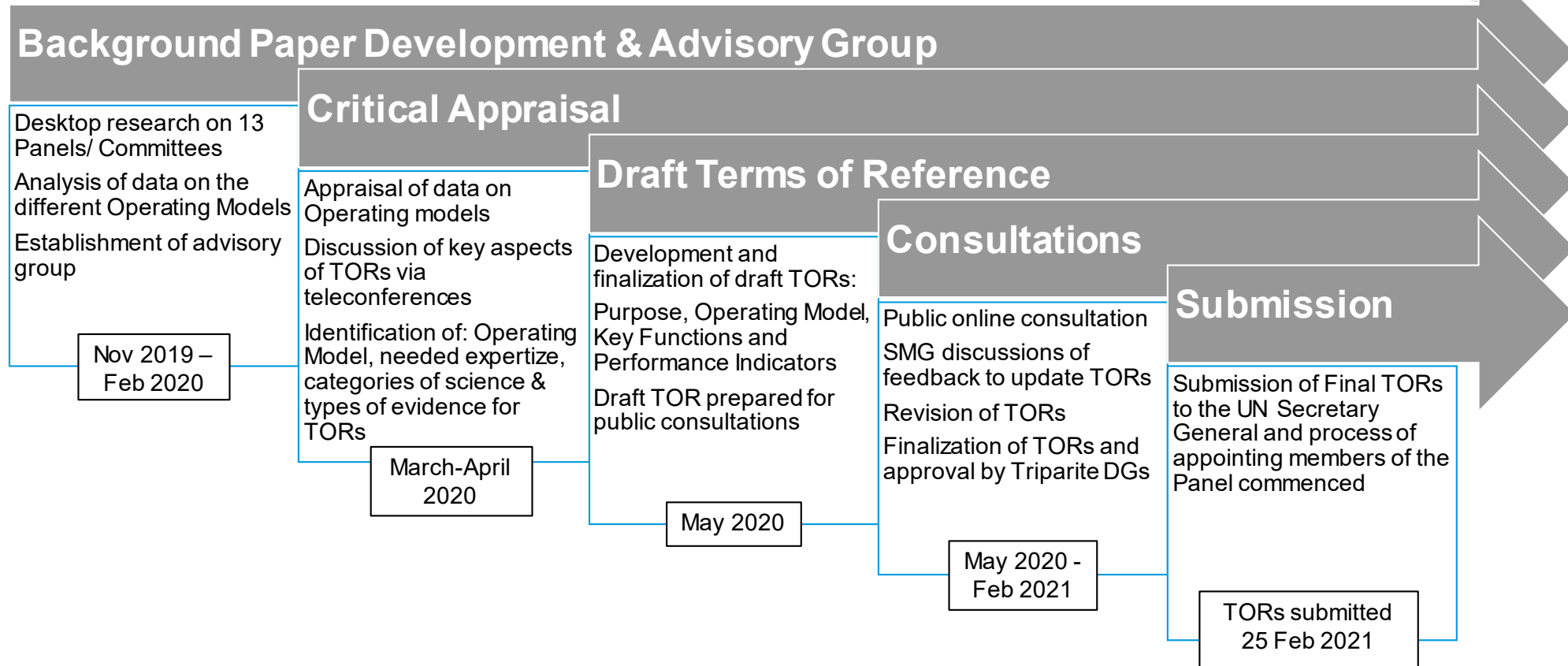
# Key functions of the Tripartite Joint Secretariat

**Purpose:** Consolidated cooperation between WHO, FAO and OIE drawing on their core mandate and comparative advantages to address the wide range of needs of the global response against AMR



# Establishment of the Independent Panel

In their final report in 2019, the IACG “requested the UN Secretary-General, in close collaboration with the Tripartite agencies, UNEP and other international organizations, to convene an Independent Panel on Evidence for Action against Antimicrobial Resistance in a One Health context to monitor and provide Member States with regular reports on the science and evidence related to antimicrobial resistance, its impacts and future risks, and recommend options for adaptation and mitigation.”



# Partnership platform

The objective of the partnership platform is to engage institutions representing states, markets and civil society to shape a shared global vision and work on specific actions in common cause.

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# AMR Multi-Partner Trust Fund

# AMR Multi-Partner Trust Fund (AMR MPTF)

- A **joint approach** between Tripartite partners (FAO, OIE, WHO), on all three levels of the WHO (country, regional, global), and with national governments and other relevant stakeholders
- Supports Tripartite to **scale up efforts of** One Health approaches to AMR
- Covers a **5-year time period** from 2019-2024
- Current donors (in USD): UK (7,666,704), Fleming Fund (4,979,455), Netherlands (4,979,455), Sweden (2,086,147)

## Country projects

In 2020, 11 LMICs were invited to submit proposals to the MPTF. Of these, 6 countries - **Morocco, Kenya, Zimbabwe, Ghana, Cambodia, Indonesia** - were approved by the last Steering Committee held in October 2020. The remaining countries are expected to have their proposals approved in 2021.

## 4 global projects in 2021

<b>TISSA proposal</b>	Global web-based repository on AMR & AMU data across humans, animals, food and agriculture sectors
<b>Monitoring &amp; Evaluation</b>	Global-level monitoring and aggregation of indicator data at sectoral level
<b>Legal and regulatory frameworks</b>	Development of a Tripartite One Health assessment tool for AMR-relevant legislation
<b>Environment</b>	Strategic global-level governance advocacy initiatives on AMR



# Strengthening partnerships – through multi-partner funding



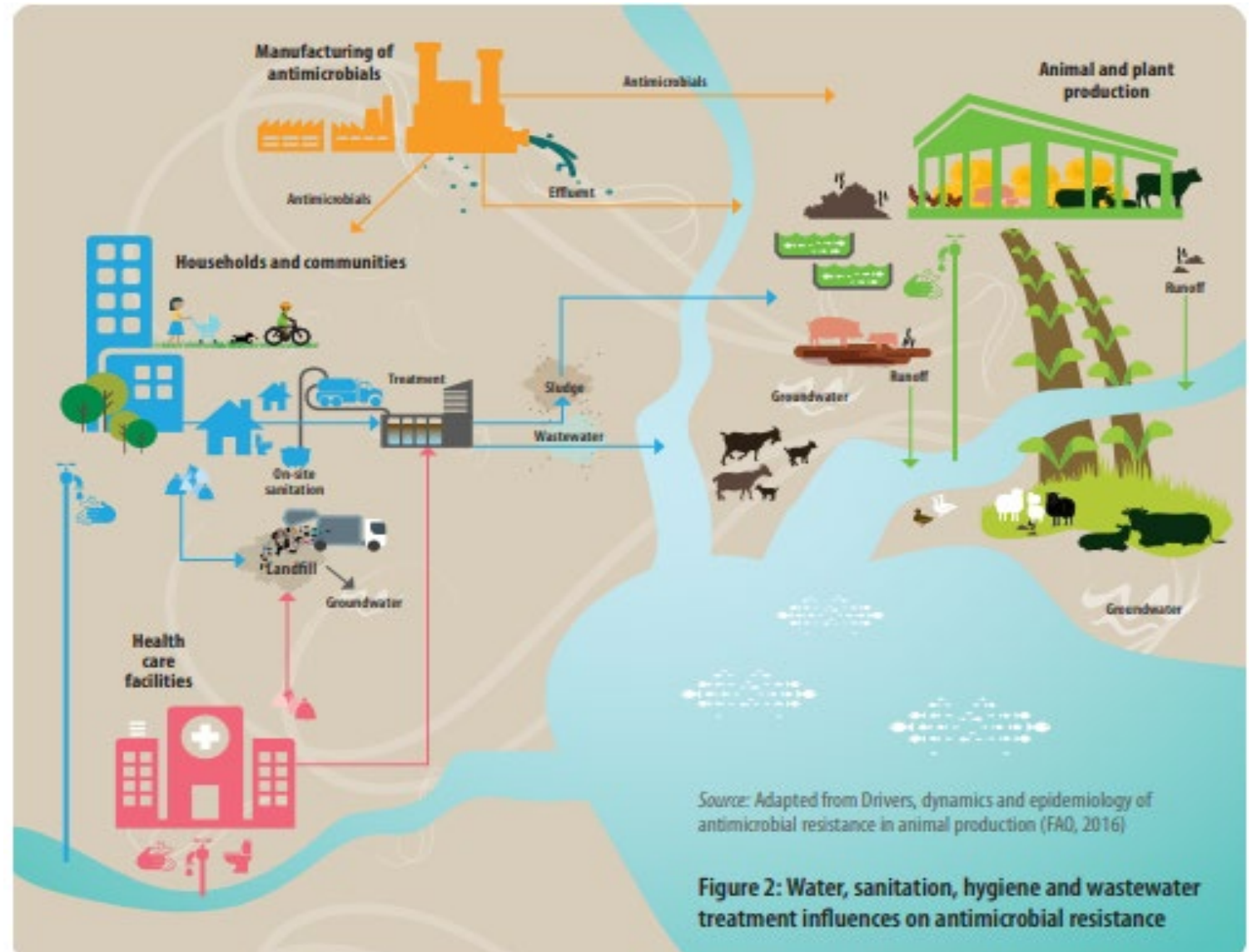
MPTF = **Proven model** – in the UN system for major crises (MPTF Gateway)



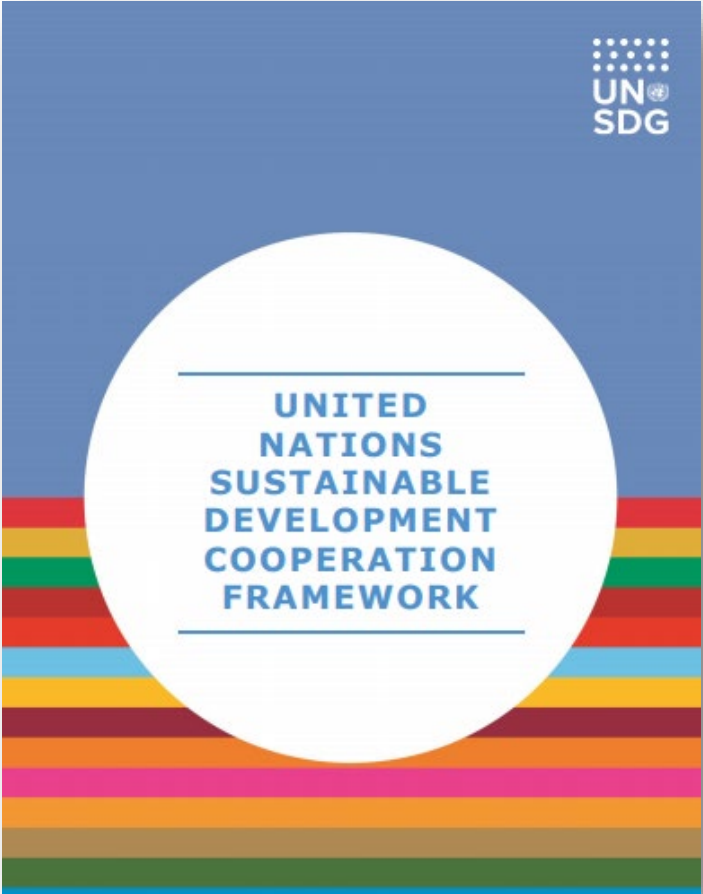
- Enables **joint work and reduced competition**

# The environment and UNEP

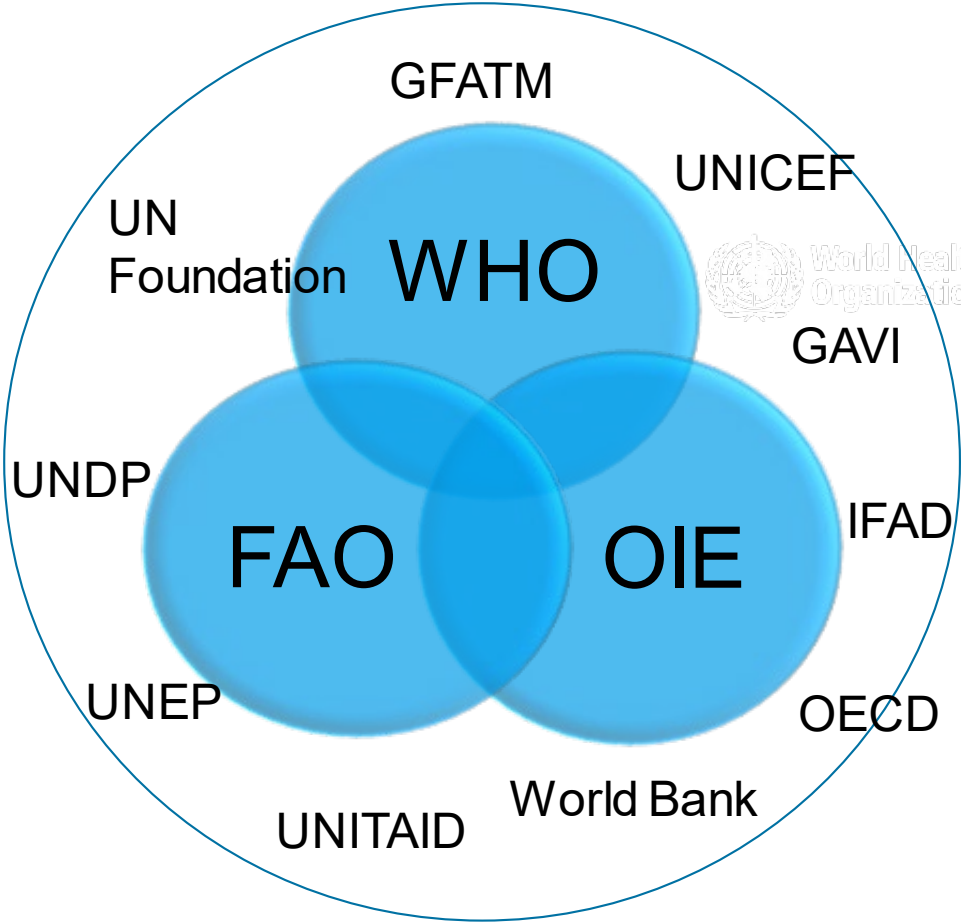
- Increasing evidence base on role of the environment in development and transmission of AMR
