The technical support instrument (TSI)

How does it work?

An EU Member State wishing to receive technical support <u>submits a request</u> to the Commission, via a national Coordinating Authority. This <u>request must be submitted by 31 October</u> of each year.

The Commission analyses the requests received and enters into dialogue with the national Coordinating Authorities to assess the country' specific needs and the options to support the design and implementation of the reforms.

Support may be provided directly through the Commission's in-house expertise or with other providers of technical support:

- experts from EU Member States' national administrations (TAIEX)
- international organisations
- private firms and consultancies
- •individual experts from the private sector



Possibilities for submission of multicountry requests under TSI 2022

Formats

Similar/same coordinated requests

Description

Similar/same requests submitted by several Member States, following coordination between these Member States: after the selection, the requests may be merged into a joint project

2 "Lead" request

Request submitted by one Member State ("lead" Member State), involving or on behalf of one or several other Member States (option will be developed if Member States express strong interest)
