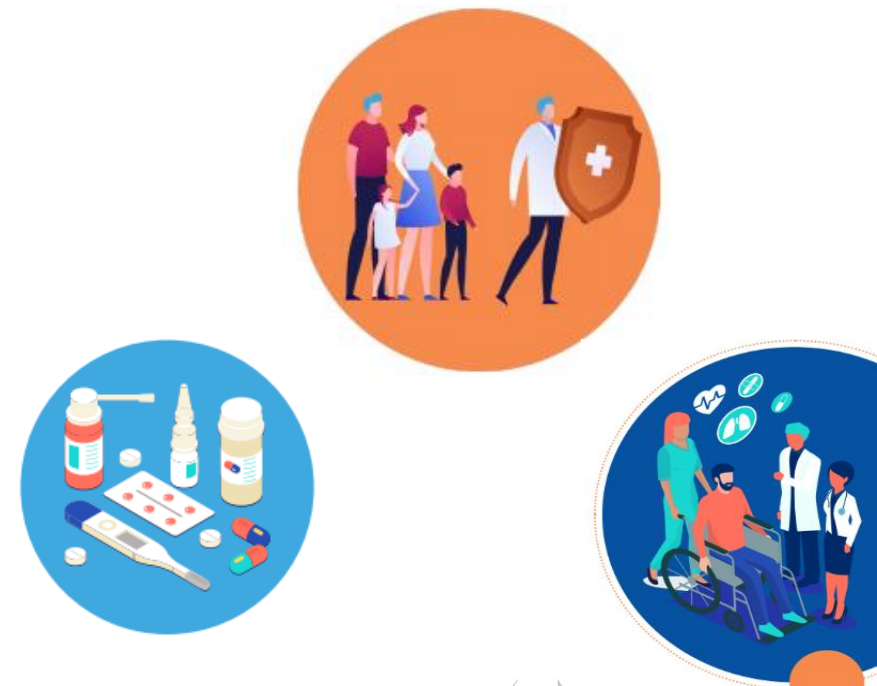
- To be adopted end 2021/early 2022
