TRANSITION - Digital Transition and Digital Resilience in Oncology

TRANSITION focuses on digital skills training to increase professionals' digital literacy, usage of digital tools, and effective integration of technology in practice.

Despite digital health's potential, challenges persist in cancer care, including a scarcity of workforce training on digital skills and limited digital health literacy. Digital literacy among healthcare professionals, non-clinical professionals and cancer patients is crucial for the successful digital solutions uptake and integration across the cancer continuum hence capitalising on its full potential. TRANSITION is expected to foster up-skilling and re-skilling in the context of digital health solutions.

Education and training in digital health are identified as top priorities for developing the future healthcare workforce, improving the quality of care and quality of care experience and enabling patient access to improved healthcare services. There is also a need for a cultural shift, combining clinical understanding with technology and change management, to ensure seamless integration of digital technology into healthcare practice and drive learning across healthcare organisations.

The TRANSITION project aims to address these challenges by:



- Developing training on digital skills for the health workforce,
- Focusing on the needs of clinicians, non-clinical professionals, patients, and their informal carers across the cancer care journey.
- Supporting the use of existing digital tools (i.e. mobile Apps), and enhancing preparedness for adopting new ones.



The project is expected to deliver on digital skills training, which will be delivered to healthcare professionals and nonclinical professionals through a "Training of the Trainer" approach.

Beyond supporting the workforce in terms of digital solutions utilisation and digital preparedness it is envisioned that the TRANSITION project will also facilitate a swifter transition to more effective and cost-effective and patientcentred health models.

TRANSITION brings together an interdisciplinary consortium of 25 partners from 14 member states with extensive expertise in the development, assessment, and successful implementation of continuous professional development and training programmes in health.
