Council of Europe vs EU: Do not get confused



Council of Europe:

47 member states. 800 million of Europeans

An international organisation in Strasbourg which comprises 47 countries of Europe



European Union:

27 member states. 500 million of citizens

Member states have delegated some of their sovereignty so that decisions on specific matters of joint interest can be made democratically at European level.

No country has ever joined the EU without first belonging to the Council of Europe.

Council of Europe vs EU: Different Roles, Shared Values



Same fundamental values:

Human rights, democracy, rule of law

Different, yet complementary, roles:

The CoE brings together governments to agree minimum legal standards in a wide range of areas. It then monitors their implementation and provides technical assistance to help them do so.

The EU refers to the same values for its **deeper political and economic integration processes**. It often builds upon CoE standards when drawing up legal instruments and agreements and regularly refers to CoE standards and monitoring work in its dealings with neighboring countries, many of which are CoE member states.

The Council of Europe has been working in the area of organs, tissues and cells transplantation since 1987


















Waiting Lists are Longer Than Ever Before

Why A European Organ Donation Day?




Encourage debate, provide information and sensitise the public on organ donation and transplantation so that each person can decide on donation.

Increase the number of donors so we can save and improve the life of as many patients as possible.


Who Is The European Organ Donation Day For?

Who Is The European Organ Donation Day For?




Organ transplantation is a complex process that requires intense cooperation between several partners.

Encourage people to speak and think about organ donation and communicate their wishes to their relatives







- NEW: Campaign specially designed for social and online medias
- As numerous video resources exist online delivering more testimonials or institutional messages
- 2013 EODD Strategy: show short and animated characters to illustrate 4 lives (all ages either recipients or donor)
- Aim: avoid drama, pathos, guiltiness, repetition to create interest, awareness, receptiveness for the message to be delivered
