Publications and Indicator Development

- Online publication on health statistics
 - Work ongoing: >30 Statistics Explained articles, finalisation expected by July 2015, http://ec.europa.eu/eurostat/statistics-explained/index.php/Health in the European Union %E2%80%93 facts and figures
- Current indicators work
 - Joint Assessment Framework on Health
 - EU-SILC selecting health variables for future SILC modules on health, children and quality of life



Meetings

Meetings done or planned for 2015

- TG Causes of Death: 16-17 March
- TF Health Care Non-Expenditure: 23-24 April
- TF Global Activity Limitation Instrument (GALI): 22 May
- TF Health Care Expenditure: end September (?)
- TG Health Interview Surveys (HIS): 8-9 Oct
- WG European Statistics on Accidents at Work (ESAW): 15-16 Oct
- WG Public Health: 26-27 Nov
- TF European Health Interview Survey (EHIS): December

Statistics on Income and Living Conditions (SILC)

- Development of EU-SILC 3-yearly health module:
 - 20 health-related variables (+ 7 variables in SILC nucleus)
 - 17 already approved by TF on SILC:
 - health status (functional limitations)
 - health care (consultations of health professionals, financial burden)
 - health determinants (BMI, smoking, physical activity, fruit and vegs)
- 2016 module on access to services:
 - Variables on access to health care and home care included



Statistics on Income and Living Conditions (SILC) (2)

Preparation of test module in 2017

- For testing of some variables, either included in the Regulation or in ESS agreement (voluntary)
- Proposed to include mainly health-related variables on children and variables of the 3-yearly health module
- Qualitative pre-testing of some variables in two rounds in 2015

Quality of life module:

- Variables on mental well-being are considered for inclusion



European Health Interview Survey (EHIS)

EHIS wave 2:

- Microdata of most MS to be sent to Eurostat by Sep 2015 (for all by Sep 2016)
- Dissemination from 2016

EHIS wave 3:

- To be implemented in 2019
- To be discussed: periodicity and inclusion of a disability module
- Preparatory work to start in 2015 including TG HIS (8-9 Oct), WG Public Health (26-27 Nov), TF EHIS (Dec).



Global Activity Limitation Indicator (GALI)

- Modernisation of social statistics GALI as a core variable in social surveys (LFS, SILC etc.)
 - Disability breakdown for other variables via GALI?
- Actions for improvement:
 - Methodological study for qualitative testing of different versions of GALI in DE/EN/FR (final results in June)
 - GALI Task-Force on 22 May to discuss a proposal for improved GALI



Disability statistics

- 2011 Labour Force Survey (LFS) ad-hoc module on employment of disabled people
 - Results available on Eurostat website since July 2014
 - Statistics Explained articles gradually online from December 2014
- Ca. 40 data sets based on SILC data (using GALI as breakdown) disseminated in Oct 2014



Disability Statistics (2)

- European Health and Social Integration Survey (EHSIS)
 - Micro-data received, validation finalised
 - Data to be published on Eurostat website by the end of June 2015 (around 40 new datasets)
 - No EHSIS in the future (modernisation strategy, possible integration of a disability module into EHIS)



Health and Safety at Work

- European Statistics on Accidents at Work (ESAW)
 - Deadline for receiving MS data: 30 June N+2
 - New in 2015: 3 out of 9 phase III variables, information on NACE Rev.2 sectors B and O-S at 4 digits level mandatory
 - Ongoing issues with reference populations
- European Occupational Diseases Statistics (EODS)
 - First two DG EMPL OCCUSTAT meetings to create short list of ODs with the aim of a simplified data collection
- LFS ad-hoc module on accidents at work and other work related health problems
 - Data disseminated in February 2015
 - Ongoing analysis from a 10-months contract by September



Health Care Expenditure

- Annual Joint Questionnaire (OECD, ESTAT, WHO)
- JHAQ 2015 data collection exercise
 - 21 MSs + 3 EFTA countries submitted SHA 1.0 or SHA 2011 data so far
 - Eurostat will publish only SHA 2011 data as agreed by WG Public Health 2014
- JHAQ 2016 data collection exercise
 - Under Commission Regulation (SHA 2011)



Health Care Expenditure (2)

- Development of a Commission Regulation on health care expenditure & financing data based on SHA 2011
 - Published in the Official Journal on 6 March 2015
 - In force in 2016
 - Derogations granted to 4 countries
- On-going methodological developments
 - Out-of-Pocket (OOP)
 - Long-Term Care
 - 3rd pilot based on SHA 2011
- Grants allocated to 6 countries for methodological developments related to the implementation of SHA 2011



Causes of Death - COD

- Regular dissemination of 2012 data
- Published tables on public health themes:
 - Amenable & preventable mortality
 - Infant deaths by cause and age
 - Deaths related to transport accidents
 - Deaths related to dementias including Alzheimer
 - Deaths related to infectious diseases
- Potential years of life lost (threshold: 70 years) expected to be published before summer



Health Care Non-Expenditure

- Task-Force on developing an Implementing Regulation on health care non-monetary data (IR HCARE) met twice in 2014 and in April 2015
- Basis: Joint Questionnaire (JQNMHC) with OECD and WHO and the Eurostat additional module
- Past: identified relevant variables, then worked on definitions of those variables to improve comparability
- First results presented to WGPH on 16-17 December
- TF meeting (April) decided on revised definitions and guidelines for best estimates
- Next steps:
 - Launch soon call for proposals to pilot mandatory variables
 - Piloting expected December 2015 July 2016
 - First results from piloting expected in summer 2016



Diagnosis-specific Morbidity (MORB)

- Invitation to NSA for providing national inventories in June 2014
 - 13 MS are participating: Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Finland, France, Croatia, Hungary, Malta, The Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Slovenia and United Kingdom
 - Project takes 12 months
 - An expert group coordinates the completion of a precise and exhaustive questionnaire

Second wave 2015

- Launch planned for 2nd quarter of 2015
- Most missing countries indicated their interest

Mid 2017

Analysis/conclusions by the coordination group



Project: Health Expenditures by Diseases & Conditions - HEDiC

- Goal: Develop a methodology for compiling data on cost of illness applicable in all European countries (EU and EFTA)
- **Tenderer:** Consortium of 9 NSI and 3 research groups with LU as leader, plus 6 observer countries considering to follow the pilots

Main tasks

- 1. Compiled a data inventory for MS by November 2014
- 2. Prepare a HEDiC Manual & guidelines on expenditure by disease data final discussions in Spring 2015
- 3. Next step: Piloting the methodology for compiling HEDiC data (approximate end: Mid-2016)

Main challenge

Access to data on health expenditure by disease collected by social and commercial health insurance organisations
