Objective: Foster collaborative initiatives that are aimed at measuring and benchmarking outcomes to reduce variability and improve performance in clinical care




Role of hospitals to support ERN networks' data collection

- Most clinical data is collected in hospital settings
- Comprehensive vs. focused data collection in the CPMS platform
- Role of data standardization to facilitate data sharing
- Support for continuous data acquisition to facilitate long term ERN network evaluation

Challenges

- Core vs. ERN specific indicators
- Start small but grow steadily in capacity with a solid foundation
- Avoid duplication in efforts
- Clear visualization of resources needed
- Standardization of indicators under a common clinical documentation structure (HL7, FIHR)
- Hospital involvement should facilitate, not be a hindrance





Hospital collaborating together to establish platforms for standardized data sharing should be a valuable asset for ERN network development
