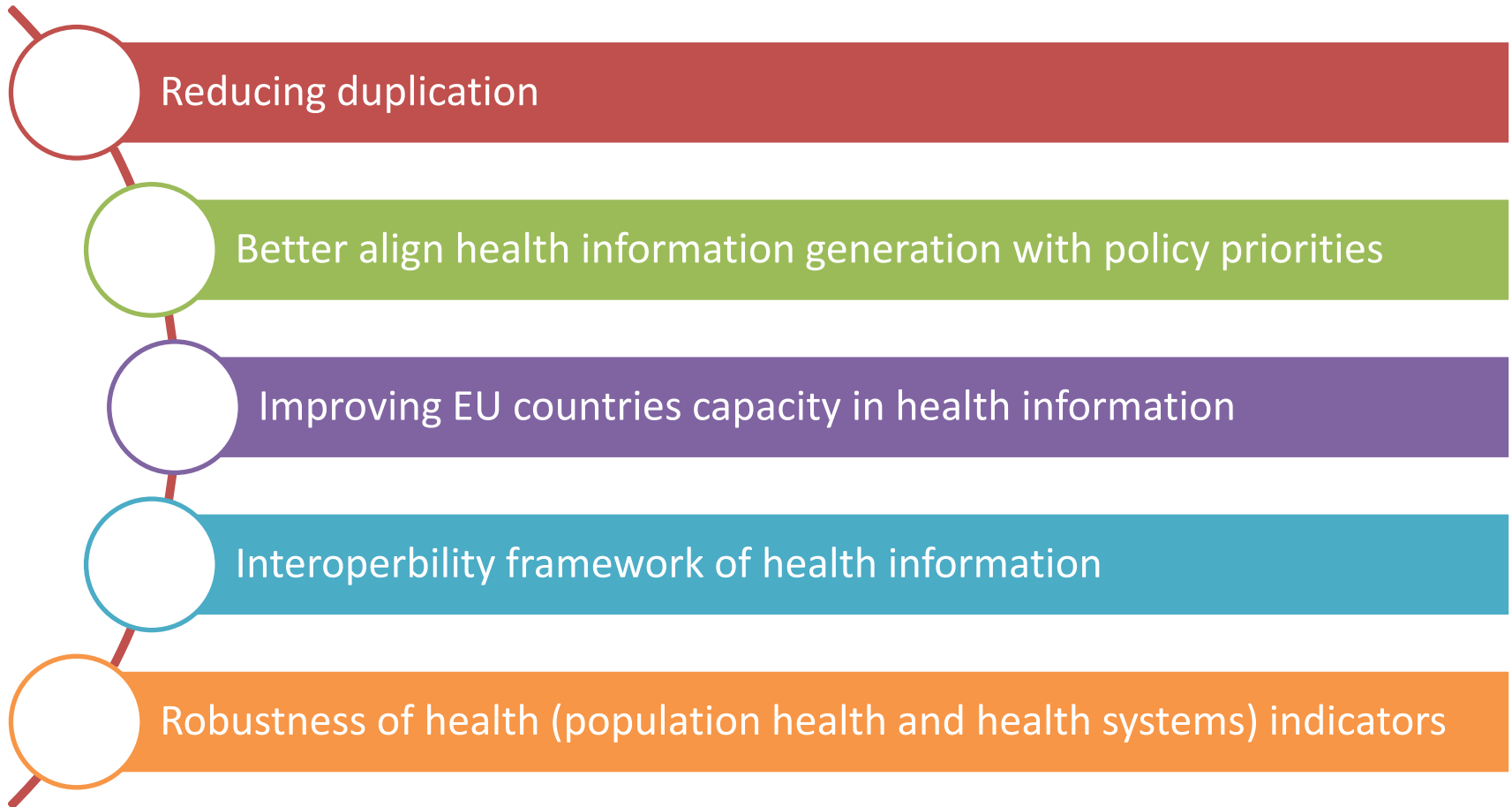

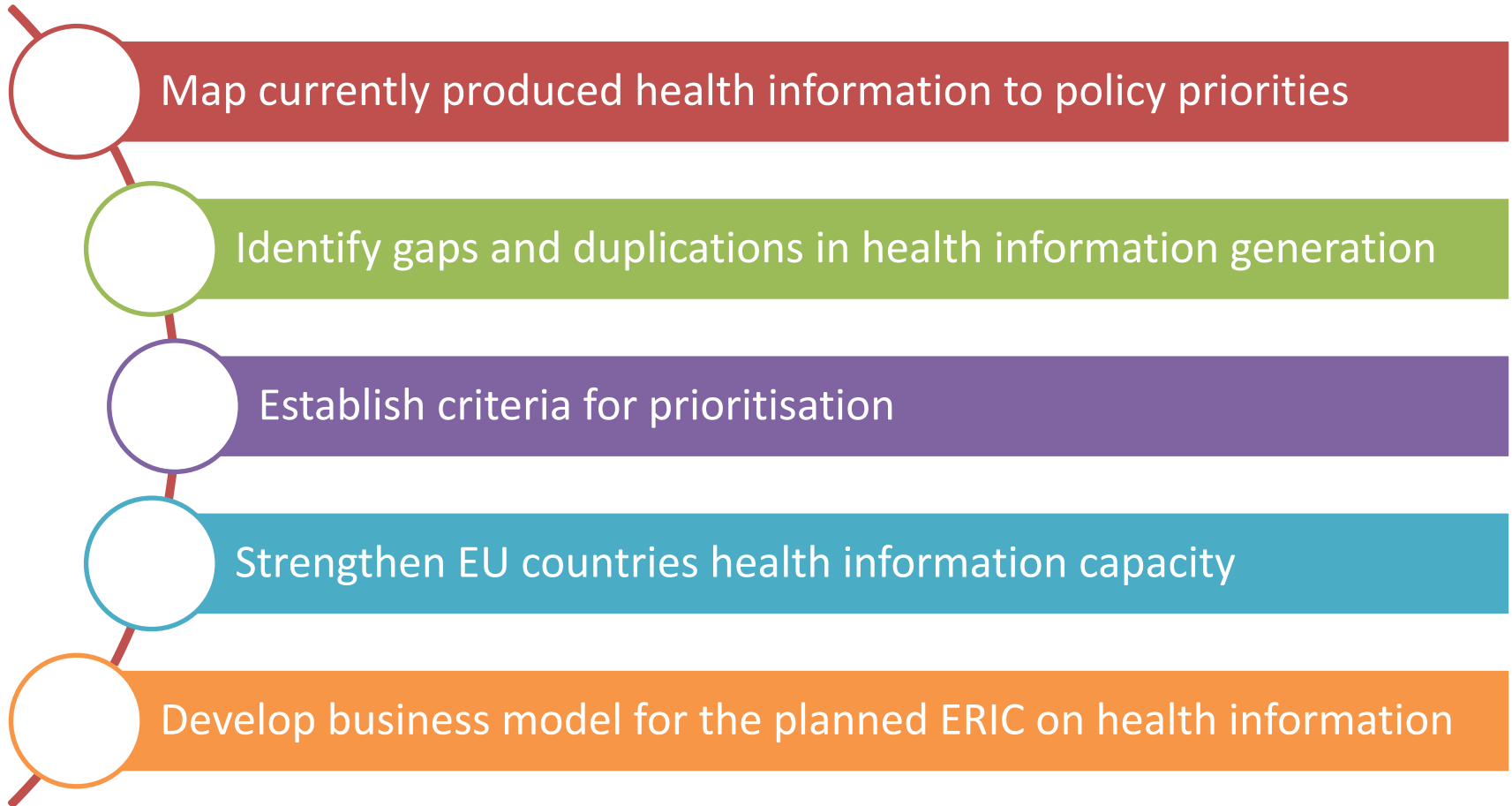

Map EU countries' health information

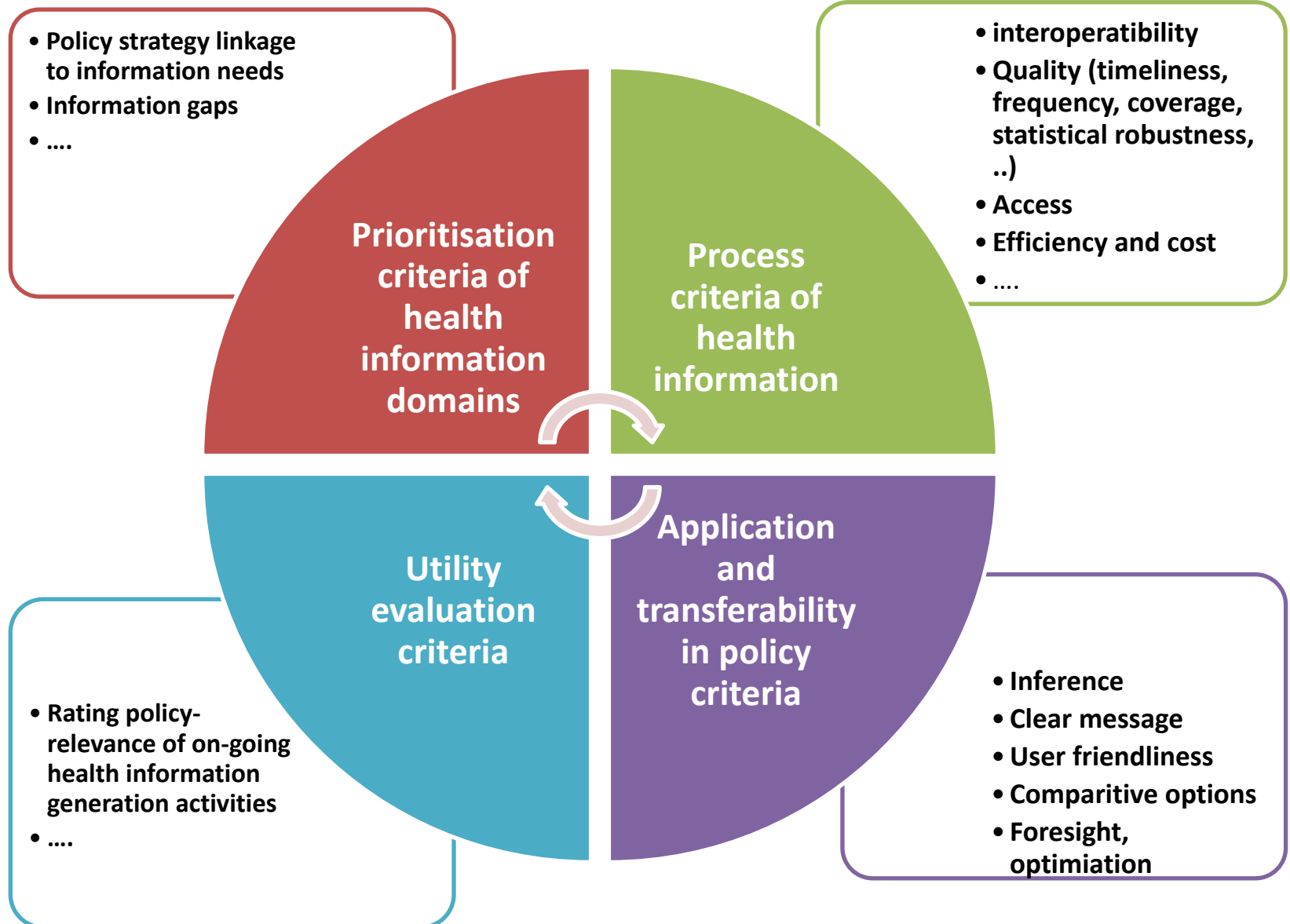
- Map health information to policy priorities
- Map relevant health information research activities and networks
- Strengths and weaknesses assessment of EU countries' health information e.g. WHO tool
- Usage of health information in different setting at EU (e.g. EU semester), national level and regional level
 - Linking strategies and priority needs to health information needs
 - Integration of previous/current health information developments
 - Filling gaps and reducing duplication
 - Application of blueprints of essential functions of health information e.g. BRIDGE Health

Horizontal activities

Horizontal challenges

- 1) Transferability of health information and data for policy
- 2) Health information inequality within the EU and within MS
- 3) Information at regional level (ECHI indicators, health inequalities) and for specific population groups
- 4) Standardisation methods of the collection and exchange of health information
- 5) Data quality methods including internal and external validation of indicators
- 6) Priority setting methods in health information
- 7) Ethical and legal issues in health information

Establish criteria



Capacity building: organisation training program in health information

- Exchange of people
 - Creating a cohort and linking people that have been trained to work in the same (methodological) way
- Content training programs
 - Modules on: quality, accessibility, availability, methods for benchmarking evidence, monitoring and assessing health system performance

Capacity building (2)

- A strategic study on how to create a pilot project to develop the best feasible opportunities for HSPA research and determine its priorities
- E-health records for increasing cost effectiveness of health information
 - Identifying and sharing best practice in
 - E-health record keeping and internal data sharing in health information across the EU
 - PROMS & PREMS to gain insight into effectiveness of services

Develop business model for the planned ERIC on health information

- Landscape financing resource for health information at EU and national level
- Position of ERIC in relation to the health information landscape (WHO, OECD, ESTAT, JAF Health, EC cycle,..)
- Define priorities in health information and translate into a multi-annual work plan
- Define national and domain specific nodes
 - Roadmap for domain specific networks management: selection and evaluation process of nodes with EGHI
 - Set-up national nodes and national counterparts
- Strengthen the EU countries support for the ERIC
