Policy Framework on HIV/AIDS in EU and neighbouring countries

- Commission Communication on Combating HIV/AIDS in the European Union and neighbouring countries 2009-2013 COM(2009)569,
- Annexed to it Action Plan 2009-2013
- Action Plan on HIV/AIDS in the EU and neighbouring countries: 2014-2016, SWD(2014) 106 final (published on 14th March 2014)



Commission policy priorities on HIV/AIDS

Main objectives of the policy framework:

- 1. To reduce HIV infections
- 2. To improve access to prevention, treatment and care
- 3. To improve the quality of life of people living with HIV/AIDS



The focus of the Commission Communication and action plan

Politics & policies (political leadership)

Prevention (+treatment)

Priority groups (MSM, IDUs, migrants) Broad involvement of Civil Society and other stakeholders

Priority regions
(East European EUMS, and neighbouring countries to the East)

Knowledge base and dissemination



Prolongation of Action Plan: Framework and scope

- EU policy framework is defined by 2009 Commission Communication
- Strong advocacy particularly from civil society for a follow-up Communication
- Prolongation of the Action Plan as an interim solution to allow continuity of EU action beyond 2013 (within the existing policy framework)
- External evaluation of the EU strategy (ongoing) to provide basis for the development of options for a potential future EU policy framework



Prolongation of Action Plan: Evidence base

- ECDC monitoring report on the implementation of the 'Commission Communication and Action Plan for combating HIV/AIDS in the European Union and neighbouring countries, 2009–2013'
- Recommendations of the high-level meeting on HIV and Human Rights "Right to health, right to life" (May 2013)



Prolongation of Action Plan: Consultation process

Carried out from August to November 2013:

- European Commission ad hoc inter-service consultation group (DGs DEVCO, ELARG, HOME, JRC, JUST, RTD, and EEAS)
- Think Tank on HIV/AIDS (Member State representatives)
- HIV/AIDS Civil Society Forum
- UNAIDS, WHO
- EU agencies: ECDC, EMCDDA, CHAFEA



1. Politics and policies

Continued need for political leadership (on EU and national level), particularly to: Address HIV/AIDS and Human Rights:

"Tackle stigma, discrimination, and legal barriers in relation to HIV status, ensuring equal access to prevention, testing and treatment"



2. Prevention (+ treatment as prevention)

Targeted and combination prevention and treatment for HIV/AIDS and co-infections

"Targeted integrated prevention and treatment to most at risk groups (including sex workers and prisoners) as central focus of national HIV-AIDS and STI strategies"

"Prevention and integrated HIV, and co-infections treatment, including in prisons and other particular settings, using innovative strategies to reach target groups..."



2. Prevention

Education

"Better awareness on sexual and reproductive health"



3. Priority groups

- Men who have sex with men, people who inject drugs and migrants remain priority groups.
- Increased focus on additional risk groups such as prisoners and sex workers.



Prolongation of Action Plan

Issues for further consideration (i.e. for a future policy framework) identified during the consultation process:

- Further explore the need to provide targeted support to additional populations at risk (other than MSM, IDUs, migrants)
- Development of integrated strategies to address HIV/AIDS, co-infections and other sexually transmitted diseases
- Need to consider addressing other co-morbidities (HIV as chronic disease, ageing of patients)
- Appraise the possibility to use Joint Procurement to acquire antiretrovirals



Prolongation of Action Plan: Funding sources

Funding of the Action Plan builds on existing instruments:

- EU Health Programme,
- EU Framework Programme for Research and Innovation (Horizon 2020),
- EU Structural Funds,
- the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria,
- Development Cooperation Instrument and
- European Neighbourhood and Partnership Instrument.



Next Steps:

- •Dissemination of Action Plan to stakeholders and further discussions with Member States and Civil Society (particularly regarding implementation):
 - Health Security Committee (8 May)
 - Media Cluster meeting on HIV/AIDS under the Greek EU Presidency (12/13 June)
 - Council Working Party on Public Health (16 June)
 - HIV/AIDS Civil Society Forum (8/9 July)
 - Think Tank on HIV/AIDS (9/10 July)
- Discussions on potential consideration by Council
- •Consideration of options for a potential future policy framework on HIV/AIDS and co-infections (once new Commission has entered into office)
