

SUSTAINABLE SCHOOL FOOD PROGRAM (SFSP)



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Healthy and Sustainable Food Systems

The SFSP began in 2014, based on 4 axes of action:

- Production - organic vegetable gardens in schools and in the Environmental Education Center;
- Acquisition – exclusively to local suppliers (promotion of food short chain and reduction the ecological footprint inherent to the transportation);
- Confection – a local network of Private Institutions of Social Solidarity, ensuring together with the Municipal central kitchen the provision school meals/day;
- Consumption - disclosure good eating habits and link them to health issues.

Outcomes/Results:

- Sustainable urban planning and agricultural land use;
- Food-related local economy and job creation;
- Sustainable integrated governance;
- Sustainable kitchen and food waste management;
- Healthy food education and sustainable behavior change.
