Global strategy on human resources for health: Health workforce 2030

EB138, **January 2016** – the draft global strategy on HRH and an accompanying resolution - presented to the Executive Board (EB) of the WHO.

March 2, 2016 – consultation on the revised draft global strategy on HRH with permanent missions of Member States (Geneva)

WHA69, May 2016 – the final draft global strategy and resolution will be presented for consideration of the World Health Assembly

WHO RC67, September 2017 – discussion on the Action Plan at the WHO Regional Committee in Europe



High-Level Commission on Health Employment and Economic Growth

New York, 2 March 2016 – UN Secretary-General appoints High-Level Commission on Health Employment and Economic Growth.

<u>Main objective:</u> to propose actions to contribute to global inclusive economic growth, creation of decent jobs, achievement of UHC, and complement various global development efforts set out by the international community.

Lyon, France, March 23, 2016 – First meeting of the Commission

<u>Objectives</u>: to discuss the emerging issues to be addressed by the Commission, to provide guidance on further preparatory work to be conducted by the <u>Expert Group</u>.

New York, 20-22 September 2016 – Second meeting of the Commission.

<u>Objectives:</u> to finalize recommendations and submit its final report to the 71st session of the UN General Assembly



The Commission seeks to:

- Recommend multi-sector responses and institutional reforms to develop over the next 15 years health human resources capacity for achieving SDGs and progress towards Universal Health Coverage (UHC).
- 2. Determine innovative sources of financing and the conditions needed to maximize socio-economic returns from investments in health and social sector employment.
- 3. Analyze the risks of global and regional imbalances and unequal distribution of health workers and assess the potential beneficial and adverse effects of international mobility.
- **4. Generate** the **political commitment** from government and key partners necessary to support the implementation of the Commission's proposed actions.

- Case studies or stories (single or multiple country) on the impact of and lessons learnt from past, present or future policies, plans and actions
