


New Health Information Portal



- New WHO Europe product
- Launched at RC
- Organized around policy relevant themes
- Combination of qualitative and quantitative information

Core Health Indicators 2014

- Special focus on Health 2020 indicators
- Dedicated data collection for qualitative indicators
- Evidence of increased inclusion of Health 2020 principles and recommendations in national health policies between 2010 and 2013





Health 2020 indicators

- 2 dedicated publications focusing on:
 - Data availability and reporting delays
 - Detailed analysis of qualitative indicators in years 2010 and 2013











Autumn School on Health Information and Evidence for Policy, 2nd Edition

EHR 2015 – Cultural determinants of well-being

- Well-being is an innovative element in the Health 2020 framework
- We need to understand how cultural aspects influence subjective well-being measurements to be able to use these for informing policy making, especially in a region as culturally diverse as Europe



EHR 2015 – Understanding cultural determinants

- Existing innovative work
- Need to assess evidence from a multidisciplinary angle, and use non-standard data and evidence sources
- WHO to convene an expert meeting in January to take stock of current insights and advise on priorities for future work



EHR 2015 – New frontiers

- Information and evidence needs for monitoring innovative aspects in Health 2020 (e.g. well-being, resilience, empowerment, people-centeredness)
- Placing this in broader context (e.g. related WHO work, work by and with partners, health monitoring beyond Health 2020)

EHR 2015 – Planning and process

- Internal WHO editorial committee with representatives from all Divisions at WHO Europe
- Draft report ready for external review by EACHR in spring 2015
- Ready in print for RC65 (September 2015):
 - Full English EHR 2015 published
 - In addition, executive summaries in English, Russian, French in German
 - Russian translation available




Highlights of Health

- Short analytical publications highlighting major health issues and challenges for individual countries and linking them to the relevant policy options
- Revitalization of existing publication series from mid 2000s
- Highlights of health for the Republic of Moldova currently under preparation
 - Scheduled for publishing in 2015



Data Presentation System - DPS

- Re-engineering of current DPS
- Added functionality
 - Search in data and metadata
 - Data footnotes
 - Flexible metadata layout
 - Multilingual support
 - Data retrieval via web services
- Online and offline version
- Free tool that can be used by countries
- Test phase planned for the second half of year 2015





Health Information Initiative





- Started as WHO Europe –
 Netherlands partnership
- 8 other Member States and 1 Charity become contributors

- Steering group meeting of existing partners in 2015
 - ToR
 - Action Plan
- CARINFONet launched
- Small countries considering a sub national health information network
 - Lead by Andorra and Iceland
