

Employment Guideline 8:

"Member States should ensure timely access to affordable preventive and curative health care and long-term care of good quality, while safeguarding sustainability over the long run"



Key Messages of **Joint Employment Report**, *March 2019:*

"Improving access to quality healthcare and longterm care, together with increasing their effectiveness, is a guiding principle for reforms in Member States."

"..." *"in a number of Member States reforms of healthcare systems focus on improving their effectiveness by better coordination, in particular with social services, and a stronger role assigned to primary care and prevention."*



Social scoreboard: self-reported unmet need for medical care

"Estonia, Greece, Italy, Poland and Romania face a critical situation in terms of self-reported unmet need for medical care (no "best performers" identified through the methodology)"



AGS Council Conclusions (EPSCO, March 2019):

11: "...In addition, increased effectiveness and access to preventive actions, as well as quality curative healthcare, are key premises for a healthy and active population, thus contributing to improve social wellbeing and economic prosperity."



AGS Council Conclusions:

12. "Dealing with the impact of the ageing of European societies requires sustained efforts to ensure...investment in quality services (especially to ensure access to health and long-term care), as well as improved policies for prevention, rehabilitation and independent living"



Challenges for 2019

Links to EU funds

- → European Semester documents to focus on investment needs at national level to guide programming decisions for structural funds
- → COM proposal for **Reform Support Programme**

Ensuring a renewed focus on long-term growth

→ Shift in priorities since inception of Semester to reforms which are forward-looking and focus on sustainable, inclusive, long-term growth.

Increasing impacts and national ownership, beyond expert circles

- → Recent improvements include greater opportunities for dialogue with national stakeholders
- → Yet European Semester **falls short of expectations** in terms of impacts on the ground
