National workshops



Belgium

Aim: two policy dialogues to establish a formal intersectoral and crossgovernmental working group in order to develop a national plan on health inequalities

- Strong commitment to be involved by non-health sectors
- Political commitment of the Interministerial Conference of Health to support an intersectoral working group within the Department of Sustainable Development

 from September 2013
- President: Federal Public Service of Health
- Mandate: develop a proposition of a national action program to tackle health inequalities – by end 2014
- Approval of the plan by the Interministerial Conference of Health







Poland

Aim: increasing knowledge on health inequalities, discussion about effective tools for HiAP/opportunities and challenges in intersectoral cooperation

- Identifying mechanisms to ensure successful intersectoral cooperation on health inequalities - linked to the new public health bill that is being developed by the Ministry of Health
- Well-being and health should be stronger connected in most strategic documents
- More flexibility in cooperation between different Ministries is needed
- Media involvement in tackling health inequalities is needed
- Stronger advocacy in public health is needed
- The role of the Coordination Team of the National Health Plan should be strengthened







Norway

Aim: to discuss kindergarten and its impact on health and health inequalities for children, their families and society as a whole with special attention to the project "free core-time in kindergartens"

- The project was used as an entry point for a broader and more comprehensive debate on kindergarten as a tool for equity
- An informal network of partners has been established which contributes to a more comprehensive approach to childhood conditions across sectors
- The network could be further involved in the follow up on the new white paper on public health and in the development of a sustainable framework on intersecotral collaboration in healthy public policy







Hungary

Aim: considering recent national initiatives promoting health equity from the start, discussing opportunities and obstacles in the local implementation of initiatives as regards stakeholder engagement and intersectoral cooperation

- Strenghtening cooperation with the Office of the Minister of State for Social Inclusion in the Ministry of Human Resources (as co-organizers)
- Vertical communication between practitioners and policy makers in parallel sessions
- Detailed professional debate between the academic field, professionals and decision makers
- Cooperation initiated between OEFI and the Office of the Commissioner for Fundamental Rights in their 2013 project to study children's rights to healthy environment







EuroHealthNet

5th November 2013: Stakeholder Engagement to achieve the EU Recommendation on Investing in Children: Integrated initiatives and the use of Structural Funds

Aims:

- To bring together organisations with representation across the EU that provide health / social / child care services, to explore how we can work together to:
- Stimulate the development and implementation of innovative,
 integrated initiatives that can take forward the EU Recommendation on Investing in Children, and build capacities to do so.
- Apply Structural Funds to co-finance integrated initiatives that can contribute to 'Health Equity from the Start'
