


Provisional agenda item 5(j)

- 1. Strengthening health information systems, harmonizing health indicators and establishing an integrated health information system for the European Region;
- Establishing and promoting health research systems to support the setting of public health priorities;
- 3. Increasing country capacities for the development of evidence-informed policies (knowledge translation);
- 4. Mainstreaming the use of evidence, information and research in the implementation of Health 2020 and other major regional policy frameworks.

EHII's concrete results include

- Developing the web-based European Health Information Gateway;
- Organizing the annual Autumn School on Health Information and Evidence for Policy-making since 2013;
- Launching the Evidence-informed Policy Network (EVIPNet) Europe;
- Relaunching the Central Asian Republics Health Information Network (CARINFONET); and
- Developing a tool to support assessments of health information systems and to develop and strengthen health information strategies


