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Leprosy: Definition

- Leprosy is a chronic, mildly infectious disease caused by Mycobacterium leprae
- Leprosy affects the skin, the peripheral nerves, and other structures
- The medical outcome of leprosy depends on the host immune response
- The social outcome depends on community attitudes


















Burden of Leprosy

- Disease of poverty
- 250,000 new cases per year
- 122 countries endemic, with 16 having >1,000 cases
- 15 million completed treatment
- 3 million + with continuing disability
- reported cases lower in women







Enhanced Global Strategy (2011-15)

- 2015 target to reduce new cases with visible disability by 35%
- Early case detection and treatment
- Threat of drug resistance
- Household contact surveillance +/- chemoprophylaxis
- Prevention of disability
- Community based rehabilitation
- Sustainability of leprosy services
- Research new drugs, new diagnostic tests
- Equity, social exclusion, human rights, discrimination
