APYN is non-partisan and independent from any source of tobacco and alcohol industry funding


All its work is evidence-based

General objectives



- 1. Better understanding of the harm caused by alcohol consumption among organized and non-organized youth
- 2. Raise awareness among YO that alcohol is a harmful legal drug
- 3. Stimulate the initialization of new alcohol interventions in YO
- 4. Empower YO how to effectively work with alcohol interventions
- 5. Raise the percentage of evidence-based alcohol interventions in YO
- 6. Test promising/ best alcohol intervention practices in YO
- 7. Produce materials that can be applicable also to other YO after the end of the project

Better overview of evidence based alcohol interventions in/for YO and ways of its implementation


Better overview of existing regulations addressing YP and suggestions for improvements
